#### Ethos

### Personnel

#### **Curriculum and Qualifications**

Students are taught in mixed ability groups in Y7 and 8, ability streams in year 9 and set at KS4. We follow the Edexcel 9-1 GCSE syllabi for English Literature and English Language. Post 16 students take the AQA Lit A course.

At Key Stage three we have created popular schemes of work that allow students to develop the skills required at GCSE. We hope that this will have a positive impact on results and augment the potential of our students. We are aware that reflection is a key component of a robust department and seek to continually review content, learning and delivery of lessons in order to improve the quality and benefits for students.

#### Facilities

English accommodation is in a purpose built suite of eight classrooms and includes a large English office. Each member of the team has their own teaching room. The Department is well resourced; both in terms of classroom materials and other technical facilities.
