Dear Parents/Carers,

New Intake Days

Next Wednesday to Friday we welcome next year's Year 7, which is an important time in the annual calendar. Clearly, we want to ensure the students feel confident when they turn up "properly" in September. Mrs Adie, supported by almost all of her colleagues, has organised a schedule of lessons, activities and information sessions which will put across the important message that we're a College, you're here to make the most of your ability and potential, and these three days are part of that process but because they're quite fun and relaxed does not mean that the next five years will be just about fun and relaxation. Clyst Vale is also one of the safest and most respectful schools you could imagine, and this is another important message right from the start. The days are also a wake-up call to the other year groups, too – it's a symbol to Year 8 that they will soon be looking at options; and to Year 10 that GCSE exams are under a year away and they are now the oldest and most important role-models in the main school. (Not to mention a shock for some parents/carers to think "OMG! I have a child in secondary school/ Year 11! Where did that time go?")

Looking Ahead.

Many parents/carers will be aware that we have an Improvement Plan; this is published on the website, in September, when the Governors have signed it off. However, it's well under construction already, and following Ofsted's visit in April, it will be no surprise that our priorities will be the Ofsted issues for Action: improve the outcomes of Disadvantaged Learners (who we now call "Priority Learners"), improve attendance, improve value-added in the Sixth Form, and improve outcomes in Maths. Although not a specific priority, there will be an underpinning focus on teaching approaches as well, continuing to develop feedback to students and more differentiation. We are also prioritising a review of the curriculum, careers, and a very important set of actions to engender more pride in the College, including achieving the (Human) Rights Respecting School Award [you will shortly receive a separate information letter about RRS].

There will be many and varied actions to achieve these priorities. The change to uniform is now one part of improving pride in Clyst Vale; the smartphone ban (based on the experience of other schools) will improve outcomes, and will improve behaviour and support RRS. We will also reintroduce an afternoon registration of ten minutes: this will allow tutors to follow up on attendance issues from the morning, check on Priority Learners, and provide additional time for a new tutorial programme which is being developed. We will be increasing drop-ins to lessons, and speaking to students more often about their experiences in Clyst Vale. I am hoping to reintroduce the student College Council which was very successful a few years ago. Although we remain a "Good" school, we will also be commissioning some external support to improve weaker aspects and ensure that we continue to remain "Good"! We have to reduce student absence, so for the 16% of parents of persistent absentees (90% attendance or

below), I am afraid that there will be more robust conversations, and these will be earlier to try to prevent absence. The basic ethos of Clyst Vale will not change: we have great teachers, great students, supportive parents, excellent relationships, brilliant pastoral care, and fairly good outcomes. However, Ofsted has demonstrated that we need to tighten up a few things, and change the emphasis to focus even more on the teaching and learning, to improve the outcomes for students.

Student Safety: Cycling

Anyone who cycles in this area knows that the access roads to Clyst Vale are risky for a variety of reasons, depending on which road is in question. Therefore, it is even more important than usual for cyclists to be safe. This means they should wear helmets. It also means that they should cycle sensibly, safely and respect other road users. Perhaps it's madness brought on by the recent hot weather, but we have received three or four complaints about erratic or unsafe cycling, and students without helmets. It really is a parental responsibility to ensure that their cycling children set off properly equipped and briefed for the journey.

Year 10 Work Experience

The employer consent forms are coming in, but there are still more to be returned! As mentioned above, yesterday's DLD focused partly on work experience preparation. An increasing number of schools no longer offer work experience pre-16, as it is not a requirement any more; on the other hand, the government's National Careers Strategy wants schools to promote "meaningful" work experiences and encounters with employers. At Clyst Vale, we have always believed strongly in the potential of work experience. Some placements are a disappointment, but even these give valuable life lessons about working with new people, working with adults, and the realisation that working life is not fun-fun every day.

Fri 6th Exeter Hospitals Panels

Next week we are very fortunate to be allowed to display the Exeter War Hospitals 1914-18 canvasses which have been displayed in various places around Exeter, including the Library and University. We have been asked to put them somewhere safe, which we have done, but Year 9 students will get to see them as part of their history lessons, and they will be available for other students as well. I can't resist a bit of history, as you know, so if you watched Downton Abbey when the house was converted into a hospital for wounded soldiers, that's roughly what we're talking about. In Exeter, there were several hospitals and converted buildings where wounded soldiers came to be treated. Many thanks to Mrs Padden for arranging this!

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- · School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform, PE kit and reversible jacket can be purchased from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
