Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the second half of term. The next few weeks will be as busy as usual, and there are two or three dates of particular interest to parents and carers to note.

## Post-16 Open Evening, next Thursday!

Next Thursday is our Post-16 Open Evening, with talks by Miss Haynes, Head of Post-16, at 6.00 pm and 7 pm. The Sixth Form here is excellent, with great results last summer. We run a surprisingly wide range of A-level and BTec level 3 qualifications, and subject teachers will be present for students and yourselves to find out more about the courses, assessment, and progression routes. Clyst Vale's strength (and major selling-point) is being a school-based Sixth Form where individuals are known and matter to us *as individuals*: we have known our students for five years, and have built some great relationships which continue into Post-16. ## GCSE Presentation Evening, 20th November

An important date for students and parents/carers of last year's Year 11. The year group did very well, with some amazing individual successes and a boost to the College's headline results. This is one of my favourite and best occasions in the Clyst Vale annual calendar, because it is all about success, achievement and progress. All students attending will be presented with their GCSE and other exam certificates; the teachers of each GCSE subject nominate an Achievement and a Progress Award; and there is an overall award to the individual students with the highest Achievement and Progress.

## **GCSE Certificates**

The certificates for this summer are arriving in instalments, and will be presented at the GCSE Certificate Evening. If students from the class of 2018 aren't able to attend the Evening, they can collect certificates from 21<sup>st</sup> November. If this message reaches students from previous years who have still not collected their certificates, they can come in at any time. In all cases, if a student can't come in person they <u>must</u> send a written permission note with the person who does come to collect them (even a parent).

## Parents' Group

We do some good things surrounding mental health, including developing a good relationship with Virgin Care to run training sessions and briefings for staff. Through the Parents' Group (formerly PTFA), we would like to offer a workshop specifically for parents of teenagers. This would be at the next PG meeting on Wednesday  $28^{th}$  November, from 6.00 pm until approximately 8.30 - 9.00 pm, including question-and-answer. More details in due course, but please hold the date! Parents have requested sessions on mental health, this will be a good one, it's a hugely topical issue, so I am sure that it will be well supported.

## **Armistice Centenary**

Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> November marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War. Clyst Vale did not exist in 1918; we are not a military school, nor a faith school. Our ethos is that conflict in general is wrong, and rarely (if ever) accomplishes anything positive. However, this is one of those rare anniversaries which the country will be united in marking. Further, in the Clyst Vale community we also have several service families and service children; many of our students are involved in local cadet corps. So it is absolutely right that we should remember and reflect on those people who fought, lost their lives, or returned horribly injured from World War I and subsequent wars. The two World Wars are particularly poignant and different in that hundreds of thousands of men were not professional soldiers, but volunteers and eventually conscripts. Next week there will be remembrance assemblies; on Friday, students will make their own poppy, and are encouraged to find the name of a relative or local person who was killed in 1914-18; the poppies will be made into a wall in the History department; there will be a non-uniform day on 9<sup>th</sup> November, with all proceeds going to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Rather than the usual non-uniform day, we are encouraging students to dress up smartly and respectfully on 9<sup>th</sup> November.

## Careers Week, 19<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> November

We are significantly enhancing and improving our already-good Careers Provision with a Careers Week. You will have received a direct letter asking if you were able to spare some time, even an hour or two, to come in and talk about your job and the work that you do. ### **Autumn Safety**

Even though the clocks have gone back and Halloween is behind us, it's worth emphasising the annual Autumn Safety messages that nobody appreciates anti-social behaviour in their communities, and that elderly and vulnerable people should be respected. There is also the message for students walking or cycling in the dark evenings to be visible and safe: reflective strips or jackets, and helmets for cyclists.

## Fire Alarms

Students will have reported that we had two fire alarms on Wednesday. There's nothing to worry about: both were genuine accidents (including a science experiment) caused by staff which triggered a lot of smoke. One enormous positive was that our students were absolutely magnificent in their response and behaviour, and I was very proud of them. We've all experienced false fire alarms at work, and you might excuse students for being a bit grumbly at a second alarm in their precious lunchtime, but there was none of that.

#### **News of Former Students**

We were delighted to hear from Plymouth Marjon University that four former Clyst Valians graduated last month: Joe Burden (BEd Hons Secondary Education with PE); Grace Glover (BEd Hons Primary Education); Keane Powell and Jake Good (both Foundation Degrees in Sports Development and Coaching).

We are also very excited and proud to hear that former student Sara Cox will be the first woman to referee Premiership rugby teams this weekend when she officiates at Wasps against Northampton on Sunday! Sara is also refereeing in the women's autumn international series.

## A little extra about educational funding.

You will have seen that in Monday's budget Chancellor Philip Hammond gave £400 million for schools to spend on "little extras". On average, secondary schools will receive £50,000 but we're on the small side of average so we wait to see our exact funding. Frankly, any money invested in your children's education is good news, but the "little extra" funding does not address staffing levels, class sizes, or curriculum shrinkage. To add insult to injury, £420 million was found in the budget for pothole repairs; perhaps we should apply to resurface the car park as this seems to be regarded as more important than what goes on inside the building. The funding campaigns will continue, focusing their attention on the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review due in 2019.



## **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

### **COLLEGE DRESS FROM SEPTEMBER 2018**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

#### Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- All trousers must have Clyst Vale logo rivet on waistband.
- Skirts Blue Tartan.
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
