Congratulations to the Year 10 GCSE Drama group who performed at the Northcott Theatre on Saturday 24th February. The Battle of Boat

Work Experience

"Attenborough's Army"

This is an exciting initiative which will be launched in a couple of weeks' time. Initiated by Mrs Foulds, this will be a student eco-group, and in time much more than just an eco-group.... The name derives from the powerful, challenging and upsetting Blue Planet series of TV programmes, presented by Sir David Attenborough. The eco-group will be focusing on reducing the use of plastic, which was particularly moving in Blue Planet, as well as a range of other environmental issues (litter, energy use, living ethically, better use of the green spaces within the College). Experience suggests that this will initially attract younger students, but will gradually influence and improve attitudes towards the College environment as it rolls forward. Watch this space!


Nits


Smartphone Abuse


The survey outcome and follow-up is another temporary casualty of the snow. However, on a closely related matter, I was both saddened and angered by some social media posts last week "featuring" members of staff. Teachers and members of staff do not set themselves up in the same way as perhaps celebrities or politicians, so it is both sad and disrespectful that colleagues, including me, are being subjected to social media attacks. Such behaviour damages the whole College community. The same principles of cyber-bullying of students apply: if posts break the law, we will report them to the Police; if posts are abusive the College will take serious action, even exclusion. At Clyst Vale a student who swears at, or undermines, a member of staff is nearly always excluded; being offensive on-line is arguably worse, as it is cowardly and has a bigger audience. We do not want this sort of behaviour in our College, and the culprits have not made anyone feel more positive towards smartphones in College.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

This will help to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform, PE kit and reversible jacket can be purchased from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
