Dear Parents/Carers

We return on Monday, 5th June. It will be Week A. There are early lunches at 12.25 pm on Monday 5th and Tuesday 6th June (because of exams).

Manchester

It must be a very difficult end to the half-term for Manchester and other northern schools, students, parents and their wider communities following this week's terrorist atrocity. Although we may be geographically distant from Manchester, most Clyst Vale students know of Ariana Grande, and all can relate to young people of their own age being involved in this tragic incident. On Monday these young people would have been in school, very excited about going to the concert; on Tuesday morning their seats would have been unoccupied. We joined Thursday's one minute silence at 11.00 am as a small gesture of solidarity and humanity.

I have also been asked to make parents aware of a statement from Devon and Cornwall Police:

Although we have no information to suggest any specific additional risk to Devon, Cornwall or the Isles of Scilly, we would urge the public to keep alert but not be alarmed, and to support us in keeping our region safe by keeping an eye out for anything that seems out of place, unusual or doesn't seem to fit with day to day life. If anyone sees anything suspicious that they believe may be related to terrorism, they can report this to the Anti-Terrorist Hotline on 0800 789321 or call 999.

Exam Season

I don't wish to tempt fate, but things are going well. I have been particularly impressed by the quiet, respectful behaviour of students crossing the playground when exams are in session, and coping with the changes to rooms and timings. Candidates' punctuality and approach has been the best for some years. We passed the no-notice Exams Inspection with flying colours, with special praise for our access arrangements. It is testament to our Exams team that with several thousand individual exams, there have literally been just one or two relatively minor glitches.

Years 11 and 13 departed on Study Leave today, returning only for exams, their Proms and results days. Actually, that's not strictly true – all Year 11 and 13 teachers will be available at their normal timetabled time if students wish to see them, and several teachers have offered revision lessons. There are pre-exam briefings for most subjects, and we are encouraging Year 11 to use the Sixth Form when they are in College between exams. (A quick reminder that Year 11 should be in uniform for the exams.) Clearly, we wish all of our students every success in their exams and for the future. As always, if you have any concerns whatsoever, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Summertime...

We had a real blast of summer this week, which provides a timely reminder of some do's and don'ts. At break and lunchtime, students are always able to stay indoors out of the sun. If students choose to go to the field, and most do, we encourage but cannot be responsible for sun protection, although we do insist that shoulders are covered at all times. There are several water fountains around the site providing free, filtered, chilled water; however, there is an expectation that bottles are filled outside of lesson time, and students come in a little earlier at the end of lunchtime.

Regarding uniform, shoes must be sensible and safe with toes covered (and plain black), while under-tops should be plain white. Once again, we are calling on mums and aunts (and appropriate male relatives of course) to help us explain when and why skirts are too short; this is especially apparent now that black tights are not being worn in the hot weather. Grandmothers might be helpful, too, as their generation in the 1960s and 70s pioneered the fashion to either roll up the waistband or hitch the skirt high on to the hips. To conclude my list, also making an unwelcome reappearance are thick leggings/skin-tight "stretchy" trousers made of elasticated material. We really do not want to keep students in incorrect uniform in isolation or send them home, but if we have to, we have to.

I appreciate that next week's holiday will be very different for families with students in exam years compared to others, but best wishes to you all for the half-term break.

Ski Pila 2019

If your child is interested in being part of the next Ski Trip in 2019 they need to collect a letter from Mrs Woolacott or from the folder outside of the PE office.

Pila is an excellent beginner resort with over 70kms of pistes offering high altitude, snowsure skiing for everyone from complete beginners to those who have previously skied. The price will be £969.00 which includes the following:

- Travel from College to resort and return journey (luxury 49 seater coach fitted with seat belts), plus ferry, together with use of coach whilst in resort
- Ski lessons (morning and afternoon for six days)
- Hire of skis, boots and poles
- · Full area lift pass
- Full insurance (including 24 hour Medicare, ski breakage and snow guarantee)
- Full board accommodation, including hot lunch on the slopes
- · Après-ski activities, such as ice-skating, tubing, ski test and Presentation Evening
- · College ski hooded sweatshirt

Behaviour and achievement points will be taken into consideration prior to students being accepted on this trip.

School Transport

- Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver on every journey will be allowed to travel.
 Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- · School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal
 requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the
 responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
