Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome Back

Happy New Year! And a special welcome to parents/carers who are joining Clyst Vale's community for the first time. We've had a good start to the year: the summer results were positive, especially GCSE, areas of the site have been refreshed and improved over the holiday, and the first week has gone very smoothly; there has been an excellent atmosphere around the place. It takes a week or two to return fully to the normal routines, but clearly it's better to have a good start than a bad one!

Key Messages

Through assemblies, we are emphasising some messages you'll probably remember from your own schooldays. The focus is very much on what goes on in the classroom; this is particularly the case in Years 10 and 11 as the new GCSE syllabi roll through. Students need to maintain excellent classwork as a basis for revision; hard work and good organisation encourages success; there will be more short testing to improve recall; and exam preparation is even more essential than for many years. We will also be having a particular focus on behaviour which prevents the learning of others, and our most distracting students should expect a rougher ride. As always, we will continue to promote our hard-to-define ethos of recognising individuals, developing empathy and conscience, and aiming to produce reasonable, balanced citizens.

New Staff

It's exciting times in Geography with almost a completely new department. Mrs Zoe Klampfer-Hall joins us from Wales as Head of Geography, and Mr Chris Jones from Birmingham as full-time teacher of Geography. Mrs Helene Chandler has joined us to teach Health & Social Care and English. We also welcome Mrs Deborah Custance-Baker as Clerk to Governors and Company Secretary. Mrs Sophie Walton was with us last year, and we are pleased to welcome her back into the Art Department. Ms Claire Haynes is not a new member of staff, but has the important new role of Sixth Form Coordinator, following the retirement of Mrs Dormand. As always, I am confident that the whole Clyst Vale community will welcome our new colleagues, and wish them every success in their time at Clyst Vale.

Site changes

The biggest changes have been to the Giraffe House, Sixth Form canteen area, and to Reception. The last of these has been to improve safeguarding and safe access to the College, but also looks very good. For those with long memories, a far cry from the days of a tiny hatch in the wall (which is still visible if you know where to look). There has also been a lot of painting and decorating, most of it in student areas. Like most schools, we do not have a fortune to spend on site improvements, but it is important to keep improving and progressing where we can. Giraffe House and Post-16 developments are in conjunction with our new caterers Caterlink, who have also made a good start to the term. The Giraffe House is much improved and modernised, with open cabinets for food selection, better queuing arrangements, and more places to sit.

Cycle to Work Day, Wednesday 13th September

Due to our location in a semi-rural area with access mostly by unlit country lanes, I am always torn about promoting cycling. It clearly has many, many health benefits to the individual, and to the environment. We have a small number of colleagues who cycle regularly, one or two all-year round, and similarly a hard core of student cyclists. Cycling from the Pinhoe direction is safer, due to the cycle path and safe crossing into Dog Village. There are bike racks in College close to the staffroom where bikes can be locked. So, if your son or daughter would like to experiment in cycling to College, Wednesday would be a good day to do it! It is also a great opportunity for us to remind students about the benefits of cycling and the need for safety.

The morning drop-off

One site change has been the repainting of the Coach Park. In the morning, we encourage parents who drive to drop off in the Coach Park, as this is obviously safer than the road or main road. It is a well-known fact that teenagers, especially when not fully awake, take the shortest line between two points, and do not always think about moving traffic. So, to increase safety even further *inside* the Coach Park, please could parents drive down to the drop-off sign and new zebra crossing. Students then cross, and walk down the side of the Technology block. This has the added benefit of not blocking the vehicle entrance for other cars or buses, and means students are not walking in front of vehicles across the yellow hatching. It is slightly further, but much safer. (No system we operate on site can cope with the gridlock we saw this morning: the issue was traffic backing up from the B3181 compounded by four ill-placed wheelie bins narrowing Station Road. I can now add bin removal to my list of duties.)

Funding

You may have seen the Prime Minister's comments about how well education is now funded with an extra £1.3bn, and how there are more teachers than ever and no recruitment crisis. This has irritated quite a lot of Headteachers. The campaign I have mentioned before involving seventeen local authority areas' Heads, covering 2.5m families, has now called itself the "Worth Less?" campaign, and will continue to press for improved education funding. For example, the £1.3bn is not new money; the National Funding Formula ("fairer funding") has been delayed; employer contributions to pension increases and national pay awards are unfunded and therefore have to come from school budgets. The Institute of Fiscal Studies estimates a 4% real terms reduction in school budgets by 2020 (for Clyst Vale, roughly £200,000). I will keep you informed on a regular basis, and on occasion may ask for your support in contacting local councillors or MPs.

Uniform.

Once again, school uniform hits the national headlines and social media: this year the big issue is "gender-neutral" uniform, including insisting girls wear trousers not skirts. I am so glad that we have a pragmatic approach to uniform, and that all but a tiny minority of students and parents support us. Thank you to parents/ carers for ensuring that the standard of uniform is so extremely high at the start of the year. There are a handful of exceptions: one or two extreme haircuts and non-natural dyes need to be remedied; big hoopy "budgie-perch" earrings are fashionable but need replacing with studs; and some skirts are too short to be described as dignified. We will be challenging all of these and will look for parental support; in particular, please do not listen to the complete myth that "everyone" has hoopy earrings or white flashes on their shoes whereas in fact hardly anyone has. Our expectations are crystal clear in the Prospectus, parents' information, website and planner. (Thinking about it, though, I suppose one way of tackling short skirts *could* be to insist that all girls wear trousers....)

Cans

Just to remind everyone that we do not allow canned drinks in College, in particular energy drinks which will be confiscated when seen. The can ban is for a combination of healthy eating and safety reasons. More observant students and parents will have noticed that our new caterers are selling canned waters with juice, which clearly contradicts our policy. This is an oversight, and when current stock has been sold, we will not be selling any more canned drinks. So, please do not bring/send cans in.

Clyst Honiton By-Pass

Those of us who use the by-pass and tunnel to and from College will need to remember to allow an extra few minutes' journey time from next Monday for two weeks; the road is closed for emergency repairs.

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
