### **Welcome Back**

Happy New Year, and very best wishes to you and your families for a peaceful and successful 2017. The school year provides two chances for students to make "new year" resolutions, so if their good intentions in September haven't worked yet, it's not too late to restart them!

### Partnership with Parents and Carers

Over the next few weeks there are several opportunities for parents and carers to meet with key staff, as listed on the calendar below on this Newsletter. Subject-based parents' evenings to discuss progress will be held for Year 11 on 24<sup>th</sup> January; for Year 9 on 23<sup>rd</sup> February; and for Year 12 on 23<sup>rd</sup> March. For Year 11 there will be a Parents' Information Evening concerning GCSEs on 28th February. For Year 9, the Spring Term means GCSE Options, and the process starts soon: our information booklet will come out in early February, and the Options Information Evening will be *before* half-term on 7<sup>th</sup> February.

### **PTFA**

Still on the theme of working with parents, the PTFA's next meeting will be on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> January. The theme for the evening is highly topical, given a report this week from the Children's Commissioner featured widely on the media: internet safety for children and young people.

### Winter Reminders

- Extreme Weather. If indeed the snows come (!), the two reliable sources of information are the 1. College website front page, and (if we do close or part-close) local radio; please do not rely on social media! The "rules" on school transport are that if the buses can get your children to school in the morning, they are contractually obliged to get them home again in the afternoon.
- Road Safety. Students walking on unlit lanes, and students cycling to College need to be seen to be 2. safe. Cyclists must also wear a helmet.
- Colds and Stomach Bugs. Please reinforce messages about basic prevention through hand-washing 3. and disposal of tissues; if a child has a sickness or diarrhoea "episode", standard advice is to keep them at home for 48 hours after the last "episode".
- **Uniform**. Coats, please; not hoodies. There are many ways to be warm without a hoody. 4.

Our embedded practice is to hold a "Reflection & Action Planning" tutorial, hence the acronym, in which students focus on their strengths and weaknesses across subjects, where things are improving, and where they are not. From this, students identify what their main priorities and targets should be. It would be brilliant if this reflection and prioritisation could be supported at home: parents frequently say that school is very different from their day, but in terms of working hard, being organised, building on strengths and addressing weaker areas, it is exactly the same.


### ARE YOU ABLE TO HELP WITH STAGING BUGSY MALONE?

### **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

### **COLLEGE DRESS**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

### Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
