

Transition Days

A very special welcome to "first-time parents" of Year 6 pupils student starting at Clyst Vale in September. The three transition days this week have gone very well, and chatting to a various Year 6s they are much more confident about starting after the summer, which is good news as it's the main aim of the transition days. As I said to the students in the very first assembly, transition is not an end in itself. We want to make them welcome, feel safe, recognise that there are plenty of opportunities and fun to be had, but actually transition is just one step, admittedly a big one, on a five or ideally seven year journey through Clyst Vale. Schools are about teaching, learning and achievement, but just like an adult starting a new job the immediate priorities are knowing the lay-out of the building, where the toilets are, the people you'll be working with, and where you eat lunch. It is a big deal going to big school, and I must thank Mrs Adie, my colleagues, and the truly amazing group of Year 9 helpers for being so welcoming and helpful. We talk about year groups for convenience, but there are 150 individual children; it would be remarkable of all 150 had a wondeeful transition with no worries or queries at all: that's why we hold the New Intake Parents Evening next week, to iron out some of these wrinkles. Next week.....

On Tuesday, we hold our annual Sports Day and Festival on the Field. Our Sports Day is, we believe, unique: every student is involved in something. The traditional athletics events with winners, medals, certificates, school records, points and overall trophies is at the core; enriched by other points-scoring competitions like rounders and penalty shoot-outs, with other activities like BMX, target golf and archery. The lunchtime slot is filled by student performers who literally fall on to the back of a lorry on the field. The Staff Band, "*Requires Improvement*" will also be playing (anyone involved in education will enjoy the name of the band...).

The forecast is for another hot day. Therefore, we have planned a few adjustments to cope with this. The timing of some events has been shifted to a cooler part of the day; more water fountains will be provided outside; we will keep the Giraffe House supervised all day so that students who wish to get out of the sun for a while between activities; and we will be issuing frequent reminders about hats, sun block, covered shoulders, keeping hydrated, not overheating and spending spells in the shade. Please note that we cannot supply sun creams and certainly not apply them: therefore if it is likely to be a burning hot day, we would

be grateful if parents could add the appropriate sun cover to the sports day bag. Parents/ carers are very welcome to attend – please sign in at reception. Please note that we do not allow Year 11 students to come along unless they are on an official list helping the PE department or are accompanied by a parent/ carer; in other words are being supervised when on site.

...and the week after

The last week of term is looking busy. Year 8 students will be going to Adventure International in Bude for a residential; 40 Year 9 students will be going on a history visit to the Belgian Battlefields; all of Year 10 will be on work experience (where did the four years go since *their* transition days?); and Year 7 will also be taking part in a whole day robotics problem-solving day supported by the engineering company Arconic. There is also a Big Day Out to Woodlands on Tuesday! Last year we became very aware of the students who do not go on these activities for a variety of reasons, so although we will never be able to please everyone there will be a significant improvement in the activities we will be running back at Clyst Vale.

Homework Club: Last Week of Term

As you can imagine, with staff and students all over the country and even in Europe, we will not be running homework club during the last week of term (w/b 16^{th} July). If this causes very serious problems for you, please contact your child's AtHoS because we might be able to make a small number of individual arrangements, especially if children can be collected by 4.30 at the latest.

Student Safety: Cycling

Another reminder that our location is not brilliant for cycling, but perfectly safe from the Exeter direction if students observe basic safety precautions. Helmets are essential; bikes must be properly maintained; students must be clearly visible. Please can parents reinforce this message at home.

SchoolComms and SIMS Parent App

From September we will be introducing a new, improved messaging system called "In Touch". The main reasons for the change is that the messaging service is better, more flexible, will be developed to include homework, and is also much more secure in terms of data security under GDPR. This will be through an app called SIMS Parent App, and next week existing parents will shortly receive instructions. For communications for the rest of this term we will continue to use the SchoolComms Gateway; from September it will be through the SIMS Parent App. There is one small wrinkle to all this: SchoolComms Gateway will remain the method to make online payments for the time being. We will be looking to switch this to SIMS Parent App at the earliest opportunity next year.

Skirts.

On the New Intake Days the Head Girls wore the new uniform skirts (the Head Boys declined politely). They looked really good, and the girls reported, slightly to their surprise, that the skirts were comfortable and felt good to wear. Yes, I know, I'm taking every opportunity to remind everyone about the uniform changes......

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform, PE kit and reversible jacket can be purchased from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
