Dear Parents/Carers,

## GCSE Presentation Evening, 20<sup>th</sup> November

Invitations will be going out today to last year's Year 11 students for this year's GCSE Presentation Evening. This is always a lovely event, and for students who have left us for other Post-16 institutions it's a really positive final "farewell" to Clyst Vale. Students work really hard for their results, so it's right that we should celebrate all of them, and praise those who have worked particularly hard in terms of their achievement and progress.

#### **Post-16 Open Evening**

Once again, a good example of Clyst Vale at its best. Thank you very much to Year 11 students and parents who attended; we offer a surprisingly wide range of A-levels, an especially nurturing environment, high quality teaching from subject specialist teachers with class sizes which permit a huge amount of individual support, yet we also provide a good range of extra-curricular and enrichment opportunities. The Sixth Form therefore has a very similar ethos to the rest of the College, although there are some key differences and "more adult" allowances which set it apart. Inevitably, many young people have itchy feet and fancy a change of institution after five years here; I would urge them to think beyond this, and consider where they will get the best individual support and teaching to allow them to progress into adult life or university.

#### **Progress Reports**

You should receive your child's Progress Report today. There are one or two minor changes compared to last year, especially that Year 11 have a teacher comment. This is because in the past we have bunched together their annual report, mock exam results and parents' evening into a few weeks either side of Christmas; we feel that a narrative report now, a mock report later this term, and a parents' evening in the Spring Term will be more effective in allowing parents to support/challenge! For all year groups, if you have any concerns and queries, please do not hesitate to contact the relevant member of staff.

#### Parents' Group

You'll see elsewhere in the Newsletter that the Parent Group (PG) is organising a session at their next meeting on mental health; this is in fact a 2-hour workshop led by Steve West of Virgin Care, who has delivered training in mental health issues for CVCC staff. Steve is the Schools link Early Help for Mental Health Clinical Lead and is also an experienced Senior CAMHS Nurse. We are already aware of quite a lot of interest in this session, and as numbers are limited to 50, unusually (and positively in many ways) the PG is having to operate a first-come first-served booking system.

#### **Armistice Centenary**

I usually write the Newsletter before much of Friday has actually happened, but it's been fantastic to see many students responding to the request for them to dress smartly on this particular non-uniform day, from which the proceeds will go to the Royal British Legion. And although it is not yet complete, the Wall of Poppies in the History Department is taking shape and already looking impressive if thought-provoking. This week's assemblies have been about the Unknown Soldier whose body lies in Westminster Abbey among royalty, politicians and other great men and women. This afternoon, Year 11 history students have the opportunity to watch the newly-released Peter Jackson film "They Shall Not Grow Old"; this is very powerful in a wider historical sense, but is also of relevance to the GCSE course as a section covers injuries and medical treatment, and of course the timing is highly relevant.

#### Behaviour on Buses (Again)

I reminded students and parents before half-term that we take responsibility for behaviour from a student's door to Clyst Vale and Clyst Vale to door. As ever, the 600+ students who travel by bus are almost all responsible who behave well, or at least acceptably. There are sometimes a small number or even just one who spoil it for everyone, can be distracting to the driver, or damage the College's reputation (on Stagecoach buses). We will always take this seriously: students must feel safe in College, and also on the way here or home. Please contact us if you have concerns about behaviour; it is very helpful if we could have names or descriptions, and we will keep students' identities confidential.

#### **School Funding**

It's good to see some decent, balanced reporting in the mainstream media, and if you did not catch BBC 2's programme "School" on Wednesday, it will be on i-player. This was a documentary about how education funding cuts, significant backdoor government cost pressures (national insurance, pensions), inflation, and the cuts to local authority services supporting schools has impacted on Castle School in Thornbury, South Gloucestershire. The story has also been picked up by BBC 5Live radio, too. In another development, three of the major teacher unions are working together to coordinate a campaign for improved school funding ahead of the Government's 2019 comprehensive spending review.



# School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

### **COLLEGE DRESS FROM SEPTEMBER 2018**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. **If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.** 

#### Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- All trousers must have Clyst Vale logo rivet on waistband.
- Skirts Blue Tartan.
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

# All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
