Dear Parents and Carers

Covid News

- Well, we had a few weeks without this as the first item.....
 - Despite the rhetoric of "we know the remorseless logic of exponential growth could lead to a big rise in hospitalisations and therefore deaths", there aren't really any changes at all in schools, unless a school faces a significant outbreak of cases. Once again, I am calling on students to
 - wear face masks at all times except lessons and when eating; face masks are encouraged in lessons, too, but not compulsory; and many students at break and lunchtime have become too casual about not wearing masks but also crowding together well within a metre of each other;
 - remember that masks are now compulsory on school and public transport (unless medically exempt);
 - * continue with twice a week LFD Testing (daily if there is a case or suspected case in the household, or if attending events);
 - follow the one-way routes through buildings
 - * (plus, from DfE guidance) attendance at school is mandatory; schools are not permitted to switch to remote learning; responsibility for contact tracing lies with the NHS and not schools.
- Case rates remain low: fourteen students and two members of staff are isolating. Locally, rates in Exeter and East Devon are above national and increasing; in Mid Devon, above national but decreasing in the past weak. We already have all of the suggested precautions in place in College. This might explain why rates are low, although I suspect it has far more to do with the levels of vaccination in students, 276 students having immunity from being positive since September, lots of fresh air around the site, and luck.
- Reporting positive cases during the holiday. Please let us know of any positive LFTs through Test Register and by e-mailing <u>studentabsence@clystvale.org</u>. Please let us know of any positive PCRs by e-mailing <u>studentabsence@clystvale.org</u>. If an isolation period means your child will be absent at the start of term, please also phone Student Absence on 01392-463911.
- I would also like to reassure parents that there were no Christmas parties held at CVCC last December, but if there were I don't know about them, although I can confidently tell you that no regulations were broken.

January Testing

- This will also be going ahead. The plan in summary is that Years 9 to 13 will be given timeslots on Tuesday, 4th January, and Years 7 and 8 will be tested on the first day back, Wednesday 5th January. This means that in theory no learning will be disrupted except the first couple of hours on 5th (as students aren't allowed into lessons unless LFT negative).
- There are drawbacks: if we do not get a good turnout on 4th, we might struggle on 5th; parents may not be able to transport their child here on 4th, or possibly not during the time slot. There are the usual illogicalities, especially around buses: if all Y9-13 passengers are negative on 5th Jan with any positives weeded out, there's still a risk of an infectious Y7 or 8 (but the whole point is to reduce risk and we can never totally eliminate it). There are things to make you shrug: why can't parents test at home, don't the government trust you ? There are things which Year 7 & 8 parents could do to reduce risks even further: LFD test before the bus journey to ensure safety prior to being mass-tested. I am well aware that some families can't do this, but maybe Year 7 and 8 parents drive their offspring in on Tuesday morning.
- We will send out more detailed information, timings, and who to contact if you have difficulty with the arrangements. I must repeat that we are reliant on as many of Years 9-13 being tested on Tuesday 4th January. One thing which will help a little is that students who have had covid do not need to be tested if the test falls within 90 days of the PCR test. At a rough guess, this is over120 students who won't need testing.

Year 9 Parents' Evening

• Thank you to all parents and carers for last night's parents evening. The timing of the evening at the end of the autumn term is different from previous practice, when everything tended to be concentrated around the options process in February-March. Holding it now puts some early option thoughts into place, and also gives a useful progress report while there is enough of Year 9 left to make a difference (if one is needed). Year 9 were affected by lockdown by losing the summer term of their Year 7 and the spring term of their Year 8, so a slightly earlier parents evening is advantageous in that respect, too.

Carol Service, Wednesday 15th December

Clearly Wednesday's No 10 press conference gave pause for thought, but we are going ahead with the Carol Service at Whimple next Wednesday, at 7.00 pm. There are about 50 students involved, and they really want to perform. We really want them to contribute to a lovely evening, showcase their talents, be part of something a bit bigger than themselves, and develop a whole load of soft skills. But safety comes first: being realistic, we expect the audience/congregation to be mostly the students' relatives. It is not a huge event, which is important in itself. There is no compulsion or expectation that anyone must attend, and I know that some Carol Service stalwarts will not be attending this year. Covid measures include: recommending everyone attending takes a LFD test on the day; wearing masks unless singing (keeps your face warm as well); good hand hygiene; and as much social distancing as possible in pews in a Victorian church interior with original aspects from the 15th and 16th centuries. There won't be any refreshments to reduce post-Service mingling and any minor risks of contact transmission. However, there's always the Thirsty Farmer....

Year 11 Mocks

Just to report that these finished this week, Year 11 students were wonderful, other students
were respectful around the exam rooms, and we have done very well with catch-ups so that
there aren't too many gaps. We will be retaining the original answer scripts in case they are
needed for the contingency plan if the 2022 exams are cancelled. If a student has not
completed a mock in a subject, and if exams are cancelled, and if we are required to put
together folders of evidence, then other evidence will be used from the two additional
assessments and very likely other evidence which would support the judgement of a
particular grade. So, not the end of the world, but clearly better if the mocks have been done.

Staff Changes

We are very sad that Layla Kempster, Kitchen Manager, is leaving us today for a new post at an Exmouth Primary School. It's complex, but Layla is a CVCC employee although she works for our catering contractor, Caterlink. More importantly, she has worked here for almost as long as I have, and has produced meals, snacks, grab-and-go for thousands of students over the years. During her time, Layla and her team have implemented several major national initiatives, as well as reacting to changing eating habits and increasing numbers of allergies. She has been incredibly open and responsive, regularly speaking to student councils and to the PTFA. The perennial issues in school kitchens are prices, portion size, and variety. It is also a daily challenge to estimate what and how much to prepare to ensure a good variety but avoid excessive food waste. I haven't mentioned free school meals, or Layla's work in preparing food parcels for disadvantaged families during lockdown, or how well she has managed all this. We wish her well. Caterlink will be appointing a replacement manager in the New Year and in-filling until then.

My superstitious precautions might have helped last year – we staged Bonnie & Clyde, one of our very best performances ever; although this sounds a lot easier than it actually was, but we were just about the only secondary school which managed it. This year's production will be in March (29th – 1^{st April}), but will be at Exmouth Pavilion because the Barnfield will be closed for refurbishment work. This is a bit awkward for travel, but is in many respects a very good theatre for our needs, has a much bigger seating capacity (needed because of the popularity of Legally Blonde (2)), and who can resist an evening by the seaside including a show...?

- To confirm next Friday is a non-uniform day. The Head Students have decided on proceeds being divided between Exeter Hospice and Children's Hospice South-West. Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can.

Thank you for your support in helping your child maximise their attendance and learning.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- Skirts Blue Tartan and knee length
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
