Dear Parents/Carers,

### Year 10 Parents' Evening

Thank you to Year 10 parents and carers for attending last night's Parents' Evening. There was a good attendance of 73%, and the usual positive atmosphere. As a year group, Year 10 have settled into GCSE very well and are largely on track in terms of academic performance. More evidence of this is the promising PE BTec results which we have just received. As always, thank you to parents and carers for your continuing support. I will publish the questionnaire results next week.

### **Key Time for Year 11**

The calendar now shows "January", and there are four months to the first major exams in the Hall. Teachers have gone through the lessons to be learned from the mock exams, and students need to reflect on how they did, including the process of revision and preparation itself. The overall tracking data for Year 11 is encouraging, but this is the aggregation of all individuals' results, so while some individuals are doing supremely well, others need to improve considerably. This individual focus is the feature of the forthcoming Parents' Evening on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> January (for the diary, there is also a Pre-Exam Support Evening on 27<sup>th</sup> February). Many GCSE subjects are offering lunchtime revision, workshops or drop-in sessions, and this will increase as the term goes on. Mrs Oldfield has developed a revision and study skills programme, which she will teach to Year 11 tutor groups in registration time over the Spring Term, starting next week. We have also re-subscribed to the online package GCSEPod, and students will shortly be given details of how to access this.

It is also a key time because initial thoughts and decisions need to be made regarding next September. These are not binding, of course, and all Post-16 providers are flexible. However, it's common sense and well-proven that a student with a clear idea of their intentions for Year 12 will generally have a better focus and achieve more than a student who hasn't. In many cases, specific entry requirements give students something to aim at. On this subject, the deadline for applications to our Sixth Form is Friday 26<sup>th</sup> January!

#### Illness and Absence

Just as in wider society, there is a lot of illness at the moment, including three strains of 'flu. Common sense and the usual reminders apply. If your son or daughter is ill, please don't send them to school: there's the risk of spreading infection, but should they worsen we do not have facilities to look after them comfortably. Please remind them of the hygiene basics of hand washing, catching coughs and sneezes, and proper disposal of tissues. Please let us know if your son or daughter is absent or ill, and many thanks to all of you who do this. Staff absence levels are higher than usual as well, which has a number of implications. Work will always be set, and Y7-11 classes always covered by a teacher or cover supervisor, but where absence is for a few days there are likely to be impacts on homework and marking. We're no different to any place of work or organisation: if there's a lot of illness, we just battle through as best we can!

### **Computer Science GCSE**


Further to previous Newsletters, last week Ofqual decided that schools/colleges must ensure that all students spend 20 hours of timetabled time on the non-examined task set by the awarding body for 2018. However, the final grade will be based solely on students' performance in the written exams, so the 20 hour task will contribute no marks. The argument is that this is the least unfair option for candidates, and that the task is a valuable aspect of computer science and a good learning experience for all students. At Clyst Vale, this affects just one group, who were half-way through the task, but more generally is another example of how complex and tricky the exam system has become!



# Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

### **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

### **COLLEGE DRESS**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

### Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- · School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

### Main uniform, PE kit and reversible jacket can be purchased from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
