My colleagues and I have been very pleased with the continuing good start to the term. There have been far fewer issues over uniform and phones than a year ago, meaning that there is improved student socialisation and a better focus on learning. Student attitude and the College atmosphere is friendly, calm and purposeful. I accept that we haven't had one full turn of the timetable yet, so it is very early days, but a good start is always better than a difficult one. This is, of course, a generalisation, and there are individual students who have found it harder to settle, are anxious, or who are experiencing family or health issues; if this applies to you, please contact your child's tutor or AtHoS as it's very important we know about it and can offer our support.

Harry Patch Day

For those new to Clyst Vale, we have been proud to hold a "Harry Patch Day" on 22nd September. For a time, until his death in 2009, Harry was the oldest-living survivor of the First World War, and had a connection to Clyst Vale through Mrs Padden. We do this to keep his memory alive; to keep the memory of World War I alive; to pass on Harry's message to young people that war is futile and to make the very best of their lives; and to fund raise for the RNLI, Harry's favourite charity. The 22nd September is significant because it was Harry's personal remembrance day: during the Battle of Passchendaele four mates were hit by a shell, three were killed outright and the fourth injured. The wounded man was Harry Patch. So, there will be a cake sale for staff, the Sixth Form will dress up, there will be a raffle, but underneath this is a strong educational message.

Spanish Visiting Students

We have a long-standing relationship with a student exchange company, and 12 Spanish students from Vigo will be joining us on Monday 24th September and leaving Wednesday 10th October. As in previous years they will accompany Year 10 students to lessons 1-3, after which they will have afternoon activities as a group. In my view, it's always valuable to encounter different cultures and broaden horizons, and I am sure that as in previous years our visitors will be made to feel very welcome.

Rough Play

Regular readers of the Newsletter will be anticipating this one. We're not sure if it's the start- of-term honeymoon period ending, hormones, changing weather, a phase of the moon or the approach of the autumn equinox, but some Year 7 and 8 (mostly) boys (mostly) begin to become more physical in their play in mid-September. This is usually within friendship groups, and is rarely bullying. Naturally, we remind students about how to behave, and in the context of a Rights Respecting School everyone has a right to feel safe, for example Article 19 of the UN Convention protects children from "all forms of violence". To fulfil our role as bearers of this duty, we have also increased the number of staff supervising at break and lunch times, and the slightly shorter lunch time helps as well.

The Third Stagecoach

We have a long-standing arrangement with Stagecoach that three buses pick up students at the end of the school day to go to Exeter. This means that students do not need to go to the Dog Village stop, but can remain much safer and supervised on site. Please could parents of Exeter-bound Stagecoach users reinforce this point.



Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

You need to let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If you do not notify the College, then you will be contacted to identify the reason for absence. This will help to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS FROM SEPTEMBER 2018

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. **If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.**

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- All trousers must have Clyst Vale logo rivet on waistband.
- Skirts Blue Tartan.
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
