Dear Parents/Carers

It's been a good week (apart from the weather breaking at last).

Post-16 Open Evening

Thank you very much to students and parents who attended last night's Open Evening. We run a surprisingly wide range of A-level and some BTec level 3 qualifications, and our strength is being a school -based Sixth Form where individuals are known and matter, which means that our retention rates compare favourably to any other local provider. As I stood on "front of house" duty on the path by the netball courts, it was very heartening to talk to so many students and parents as they arrived and left; I reflected that we've known most of the young people for 5 years, and seen them grow from nervous Year 7s to a point where GCSE grades, A-levels and serious thoughts of university or apprenticeships are at the forefront of their minds. There was a great deal of positivity and loyalty shown towards the College, and many parents commented on the passion and commitment of my colleagues. "Life's a journey" is a common phrase, but it would be fantastic to be able to help Year 11 on the next stage of theirs here at Clyst Vale.

Ghostly Tales

What another great evening! In previous years Miss Ruscoe has entered our Year 10s for the Shakespeare in Schools Festival, but in my humble opinion "Ghostly Tales" was a good decision. For a start it was a "Clyst Vale" event; it enabled more students to take part; it included students from Years 9 to 13; and it enabled more students to gain experience of performing on a public stage. Understandably, with such a range of ages and abilities the performances varied a little, but the best ones were brilliant, and I was delighted to see how well some of our student performers have improved and progressed over the years. The fourteen playlets were varied in style and spookiness, which meant the evening sped along; and overall there was a body count to rival many a war film, even though many of them then came back as ghosts. As ever, many thanks to parents and families for your support.

Remembrance

We take Remembrance seriously at Clyst Vale, all the more so because we're not a school with a military ethos, and few children come from service families. In September, we hold Harry Patch Day; in the summer term there is a history trip to the Belgian battlefields. At the time of Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day, we hold special-themed assemblies, collect for the RBL Poppy Appeal, and observe the two minutes' silence. The message has always been the importance of remembering and the practical benefits, rather than any glorification of war. I'm pleased to report this year that students have once again been highly respectful.

Cognitive Ability Tests

Year 7 have been wonderful during this week's CATs, coping well with both the tests and the technology. We have moved to on-line assessment rather than paper-based for several reasons: it's quicker, more efficient, and a little less daunting for students than sitting in an exam room (so is likely to give a truer reflection of ability, too). We reassured students that there is no "pass/fail" in these tests, and they are just to help us get a more accurate picture of their ability.

Washington Visit

For several Sixth Form students, this week's American election was particularly "real", as it was only a matter of days since they had been in Washington on the Sixth Form Politics visit, led by Mrs Padden. This is a great trip to the seat of American government, as well as visiting the memorials to former Presidents and leaders, and experiencing the build-up to the election. Whether a future Clyst Vale party will visit the Trump memorial remains to be seen. Student feedback? One student summed it up: "It was absolutely fantastic, really brilliant....but there was lots of walking". You will find photos and more information elsewhere on the website.

GCSE Presentation Evening

A further reminder for Year 12 students, parents and their friends from last year that this evening will be on Tuesday 22nd November. School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- · School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
