Similar to that old Cadbury's advert, we seem to have squashed a week-and-a-half's activities into one week.

## **"Find Your Voice" Human Rights Day**

This was a brilliant success. The main thrust of the day was for our student Amnesty Group to train up human rights ambassadors from our local Primary Schools, who would then return and champion an aspect of human rights. Leading Amnesty International figures came to observe and participate in the day, and they were so impressed that they wish to adopt the programme for use in other schools. As one of the core principles of Amnesty and human rights campaigning is to raise awareness, the day also included an aerial photo of at least 400 people forming the Amnesty logo, and the launch of a project (again involving Primary Schools) to create a mural to be displayed in our entrance way. I cannot thank Miss Watt enough for her inspired leadership of our Amnesty Group, although she will be the first to acknowledge tremendous support from a number of colleagues and the students themselves.

## **Local Learning Community Sports Day**

This was the annual athletics meeting of our LLC Primary Schools, held at Exeter Arena on Wednesday. Our part in it was the coordination of the event, and 46 Year 10 students attended as marshals and officials, who thrived in these roles and were great ambassadors for Clyst Vale..

## **2017-18 Term Dates: Trust Us, not DCC!**

At Clyst Vale, the Autumn Term ends on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> December 2017. *This is different from Devon County Council's standard dates*. This is especially important if you are planning holidays or trips to relatives. Our website has the correct dates for the whole year.

## **New Intake Parents' Evening**

I really do not want to tempt fate, but this year's transition events have gone very well indeed, and the new Year 7 look a very promising year group. We have more pupils coming in ones or twos from a wide range of Primary Schools, and I have been heartened by the way others have supported them. The Parents Evening is an opportunity for parents to meet their child's tutor, and raise any questions or worries. Again, it was a successful evening, and I must thank my colleagues, PTFA representatives, canteen staff, and Thomas Moore for their part in providing information and reassurance.

## **Celebration Assemblies**

Each School held a Celebration Assembly this week, with awards for all sorts of achievements including for those students who sometimes pass under the radar. In each School, here were awards for every subject, for 100% attendance, tutor-nominated awards, and Student of the Year. Each assembly also included performances from student members of the particular School. These Assemblies genuinely recognise the successes of the academic year, and do much to bring Schools together with a sense of identity. This means, of course, that Silver School's assembly was particularly poignant.

### **Year 10 “Lighthouse”**

On Thursday, 80 Year 10 students attended Made-Education’s “Lighthouse” workshop, led by Sander de Groot (check it out through Google). This was a two-hour workshop focusing on goals, targets, and how to achieve them. The various components of the workshop are captured through illustrating a lighthouse (a metaphor for seeing through the fog and avoiding crashing on the rocks). The student evaluation forms suggest that almost all found the session interesting and enjoyable, with the majority reflecting that they need to focus more intently on their goals, not let things drift, break down their plans into manageable stages, and have a better idea of how to do this. Bearing in mind that most students had “good GCSE results” as their target, this is encouraging!

### **Measure by Measure**

On Thursday evening 16 students ranging from years 7-10 attended a performance of Shakespeare’s Measure by Measure by the Cygnet Company (including two former students Jake Sullivan and Guy Dennys). Despite the complex plot an audience member has contacted me to say that our students’ behaviour was exemplary. The Cygnet team commented how impressed they had been and stated they wished all school groups were as well mannered and polite. Audience members too commented on the overall engagement and excellent behaviour of the students and were enquiring which school we came from!

### **Sports Day and Festival on the Field**

I think it was a wise decision to postpone Tuesday’s Sports Day & Festival on the Field, although if we had been quick enough we might have been able to organise a regatta instead. Clearly, Sports Day hasn’t started at the time I’m writing this, but postponing it should not affect its quality. We had planned a couple of other non-sporting events for Friday which have been threaded through the day; Year 10 will have a Theatre Group presentation, and Year 12’s final day of term will be a Challenge Day.

### **Work Experience**

We have almost all Year 10 out on work experience next week (or in Iceland, and I don’t mean the supermarket). In the hurly burly of the end of term, it should be remembered that this is a pivotal part of our Careers programme and an important part of a student’s development. Even if the placement does not reflect a student’s career aspirations, simply working in a different environment with unfamiliar adults and following instructions from someone who isn’t a teacher or a parent is valuable in itself. As always, thank you to all parents/carers for your support, whether this is in helping find a placement or, as an employer, offering a placement. (A quick reminder: if a Year 10 student is ill, please contact both the placement and us!)

### **Trips and Visits**

To all students and staff embarking on trips and visits this weekend or early next week, we wish a safe, smooth and thoroughly enjoyable time. All of the trips have a strong educational element, including the development of personal skills. For example, Year 8 students at Bude or others on the Camps International Expedition will test their leadership and teamwork skills, practical problem-solving and resilience. For trips that are leaving early in the morning, another gentle reminder to be respectful to our neighbours when dropping off students. Mentioning Bude, there was a minor confusion over departure times: it is 10.00 am on Sunday morning.

### **Wednesday’s Traffic Forecast**

Next Wednesday we could have six coaches from Woodlands and three from Woodlands arriving at the same time to join five CV buses, two Stagecoaches and a few taxis, as well as parents’ cars. We are working with Dartline to stagger some times, and looking at other drop-off/pick-up options so that we don’t gridlock the village! Please allow more time on Wednesday; if you pick up your child, and if possible can delay it, they can stay safely in College until 5.00 pm! And please keep an eye on your e-mails, in case we need to send out some guidelines via the gateway.

### **Staff Changes**

There are several staff retirements and other changes at the end of term, and it is difficult to do them all justice. Any school is a dynamic organisation, so there will always be colleagues joining and leaving; in fact, up to a point, staff turnover is a positive thing. The following colleagues have been at Clyst Vale for periods of time ranging over six months to 28 years. What they all have in common is that they have contributed to the successes of the College, taught and supported your children, and we wish them every success and happiness in the next stage of their lives. Undoubtedly, there are more changes than usual because of the financial pressures schools are under, but now is not the time to dwell on government policy. It has been a pleasure to work with all of my colleagues who are off to pastures new, to celebrate their loyalty and commitment, and to recognise the differences they will have made to literally thousands of young people over the years.

Mike Endacott (History, Business) retires after 28 years. For many of those years, Mr Endacott was also Head of Year. Paul Colin (Deputy Principal) also retires after 27 years; Mr Colin was formerly Head of Science, and has been the College's timetabler for almost 20 years. Christine Dormand (Deputy Principal & Head of Sixth Form) is another retiree, after two spells at Clyst Vale totalling nearly 21 years. Tanya Hucklesby (Hearing Support) also leaves us after 18 years to take up further opportunities to develop her work in deaf education. Nathalie Roberts (Teaching Assistant) has been at Clyst Vale for almost 12 years, and hopes to relocate to Torbay. Judith Colin (Health & Social Care, Course 42) will join husband Paul in retirement after nearly eleven years at CVCC. Leaving us after seven years to a new post at Torquay Girls' Grammar School is Tania Grigg (Head of Humanities and Geography). Jill Collins steps down as our Clerk to Governors after five years. Tania Gale (Maths) leaves us for new adventures after three years. Sarah Sinclair (Teaching Assistant) leaves after eighteen months, supporting some of our most vulnerable students. Katie Crawshay has secured a new post at Wellington Academy, and moves on after a year. Also leaving are Charley Wright (PE) and Kirsty Braddick (Geography), whose contributions over the past few months have been invaluable.

In other changes, Linda Smith (my PA) is stepping down from that role, but will continue in a part-time post. This week, we have been pleased to welcome back Ingrid Quick (English) and Claire Wakefield (Art) from adoption and maternity leaves respectively; however, this means more good byes, to their replacements Hayley Clanfield and Sophie Walton. The goodbye is only temporary in the case of Mrs Walton, who will rejoin us in September. Parents will already be aware that we will be reducing to three Schools in September, but I'm delighted that both Mrs Battishill and Mrs Knowles will remain on the Clyst Vale staff, albeit in different roles.

### Clyst Vale Loses Out in Final at Exeter Community Chiefs Wheelchair Rugby Festival

Congratulations to the eight students who represented the College at the recent festival at St Luke's, organised by the Exeter Community Chiefs. This is a culmination of the eight week programme of Wheelchair Rugby sessions, held within our Sports Hall on a Thursday morning. The game combines elements of physicality and coordination, with the main aim of the competition being the experience and having fun and respect for one another.

The mixture of students did brilliantly well during the day, defeating Kings 11-7 and Cullompton 15-7. The victories were interspersed with a defeat against the National Champions St Luke's by 9-17, who have a strong link with the Westcountry Hawks, who are based in Plymouth but come to Exeter to train students every Wednesday.

**If your child is interested in being part of the next Ski Trip in 2019 they need to collect a letter from Mrs Woolacott or from the folder outside of the PE office.**

Pila is an excellent beginner resort with over 70kms of pistes offering high altitude, snowsure skiing for everyone from complete beginners to those who have previously skied. The price will be **£969.00** which includes the following:

- Travel from College to resort and return journey (luxury 49 seater coach fitted with seat belts), plus ferry, together with use of coach whilst in resort
- Ski lessons (morning and afternoon for six days)
- Hire of skis, boots and poles
- Full area lift pass
- Full insurance (including 24 hour Medicare, ski breakage and snow guarantee)
- Full board accommodation, including hot lunch on the slopes
- Après-ski activities, such as ice-skating, tubing, ski test and Presentation Evening
- College ski hooded sweatshirt

Behaviour and achievement points will be taken into consideration prior to students being accepted on this trip.



### School Transport

1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
3. **Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.**
4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or “skater” style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

**All uniform can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter.** Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at [www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk](http://www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk).

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

**The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.**

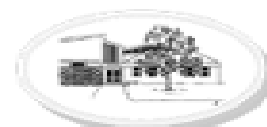
