Dear Parents and Carers,

Ukraine Day

• Thank you to students and families for your generosity, and thank you to my colleagues for coordinating it all, especially Miss Brotherton. The non-uniform day and donations raised £1140, with one Sixth Former donating £80 and a Year 11 emptying her "swear jar" of £21 ! The funding is going to the UNICEF appeal to support children in Ukraine. The collection of items filled two Landrovers, before late contributions - including some from our local community - filled a third. The collected items will be shipped to refugee organisations in Ukraine and Moldova.

Camps International

• There were special assemblies this week for students in Years 9 – 12 about the Summer 2023 expedition to Cambodia. There will be a parents' information evening next Wednesday (23rd) at 6.30 pm in the Hall. The Camps expeditions are an amazing experience, sometimes life-changing, which challenge students and in so doing develop their personal qualities. The expeditions are not cheap, and we are very aware of the cost of living issues facing families, but feel it would be wrong to not offer such a great opportunity.

• Year 11's assessments have finished, and Year 13 (and Year 12 AS students) are in the middle of theirs. I won't repeat myself from last week, except to say that students have approached their assessments with a really good attitude, and will benefit from the experience.

HMI Visit 25th March: Catch-Up Programme

• This is not an Ofsted inspection, but a visit by Ofsted to find out about covid catch-up and the national tutoring programme (NTP) in particular. We were one of several hundred schools selected to take part, and it doesn't mean we are doing a particularly bad job or indeed a good one. If you follow national educational news, you'll know that there have been quite a few problems with the NTP, and we are no different. We have been offering support for eligible Year 7 students in English and Maths. If your child is involved, we will have contacted you separately for consent.

Covid Latest

• As of Friday morning, there are 33 students and 5 members of staff (all teachers) isolating; last week's Year 8 spike has fortunately subsided a lot. This overall increase is consistent with rates locally to us, which are above national for Exeter, East and Mid Devon. The numbers in College do not require any new measures or restrictions, but it still remains essential that all of us are cautious and practice good hand hygiene. Five teachers may not sound very many, but it means that a hundred lessons in one week will be taken by cover supervisors, supply teachers, or already busy teachers. As I have said before, we do our utmost to put the best possible people in front of classes, and set the best possible learning, but we are still a long way from pre-pandemic normality.

Science Week

• Another event returning after a two-year lay off. Thanks mostly to Dr Odunlade and the Science Club, there will be three Science-themed assemblies next week, one for each School, and a Science Fair on Wednesday lunchtime.

Ten Tors and DofE Overnight Camp

• There is a fuller article with photo on the front page of the website, but I must pay tribute to our students, staff and parent volunteers. It was horrible weather on Dartmoor last weekend, and walking on Saturday was really hard work. However, over twenty students chose to stay out, pitched camp in the wind and the rain, and got going again on Sunday. This is true character-forming activity, and credit to all the young people for their resilience. Huge thanks to Mr Eales, Miss Barratt and Mr Hewlett for their organisation, very close regard to student safety, and of course they too endured the same weather as the students. Fortunately, Monday was a good drying day....

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can.

Thank you for your support in helping your child maximise their attendance and learning.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- Skirts Blue Tartan and knee length
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
