Early Lunchtimes

Parents and Carers

It's been a good week for contact with parents: there was the Parent Interest Group on Monday, the evening for students and parents of Year 6 pupils who don't attend our seven "feeder" schools, plus one or two parent governors yesterday!

Clyst Vale PIGs

The serious point is that the parents' group wishes to make a complete break from "PTFA" with all the associated stereotypes. The presentations which have already been held have been of a very good quality, and the challenge is to encourage parents to attend, safe in the knowledge that they will not be running tombolas or asked to provide sweets (or probably grapes these days) in a jar. (It'll be worth coming just to discuss possible logos reflecting the new name....)

After many years of tremendous and enormously-appreciated service to the PTFA and now PIG, Jenny Sanders and Anita Hill will be stepping down as Chair and Treasurer at the AGM in October (Wednesday 3rd, 6.30 pm!). This is because their children have grown and will have flown from Clyst Vale at the end of this school year. There is a draft programme of events for next year: PIG activity will be based around a series of parents' information presentations: provisionally, these will be on the College ethos and Rights Respecting School Award, mental health, careers, internet safety, food/catering, and curriculum discussions. Clearly, there will be flexibility as a year is a long time in a school, and issues wax and wane in importance, while new things often pop up. The PIG will continue to support the annual Carol Service, and will scale down fundraising to one or two bigger events with one fund-raising project in mind.

Smartphones and Uniform

Apologies if you already know this, but my contact with parents this week suggests that the message has not reached everyone. From September, smartphones and any device capable of accessing the internet are not permitted during the College day, from the moment of arrival on site until 3.20 pm. This includes breaks and lunchtimes. On uniform, please see the website for details; the changes affect all year groups, including Year 10 going into Year 11.

Attendance

One area where we really need maximum parental support is that of attendance. You'll see that this is a major issue flagged in the Ofsted letter, and one we have to improve significantly, starting immediately. Our overall attendance is around 93.6%. Superficially, that doesn't seem too bad, until you realise that the national average is 94.6%, and Clyst Vale is hardly in an area of deprivation and challenging social problems: we should be hitting 95% as a minimum. 95% attendance on an individual level means that a student has missed the equivalent of a day every four weeks, or 9.5 days a year. Obviously, this covers a few coughs and colds, but equally obviously any ten-day holiday automatically puts a child below the individual, College and national expectations.

Possibly more shocking is that one in six Clyst Vale students is a persistent absentee. This does not match the general profile of our students (or parents). A persistent absentee is a student who has 90% attendance or below. This means they have missed 19 days, or 38 sessions (morning and afternoon registration) in an academic year. Once 38 sessions have been clocked up, there is nothing anyone can do to stop that student being a persistent absentee.

There are many things which we shall be doing to improve attendance. We will reinstate one point of contact for phoning in the morning; we will be engaging more with parents of students who are persistently late with no good reason; we will no longer authorise holiday requests; more positively, we will be stressing the importance of good attendance with students and seeking to engage with parents more positively as well as having to tighten up; we will clearly strengthen our tracking of attendance so that support and interventions can be made earlier. We will also apply common sense; we know buses sometimes run late; we know there seems to be one set of inconvenient roadworks somewhere in our catchment on any given day; we know that students who are infectious need another 24 hours at home. However, in the coming months we will be working with everyone to ensure the best possible attendance and your support will be crucial in this.

Exams

For most of Year 11, GCSEs are now over. There are Graphic Products and two Further Maths exams next week, and clearly A-level exams continue until June 26th. So, although the site is much easier to manage, we are still in the exam season. Year 11 students who have finished their exams for some reason generally don't want to come back to College, but if they have a genuine reason they must sign in at reception and obtain a visitor's badge (coming to see their mates at lunchtime is not a genuine reason...). As I said, not completely finished, but an interim massive "thank you" to candidates for their behaviour in the exam room, to all other students for their respect in keeping quiet, to parents for all your support and encouragement, and to my colleagues for an unbelievable amount of hard work and nervous energy.

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- · School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform, PE kit and reversible jacket can be purchased from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
