Three Schools

Hopefully all parents and carers will have received my letter earlier this week, sent out via the gateway. There's one typo which caused mild confusion and for which I am sorry: 7MBr will definitely be moving to Yellow School and will become 8YMBr not whatever appeared! I am not happy that we have moved to three Schools, but it has been necessary. The main reason is budgetary, in that the opportunity came to make a financial saving at no cost. We could have maintained Silver School, but something else would have had to go instead – economists call this opportunity cost, and people running household budgets know that if you buy an expensive car you can't afford a holiday as well (unless it goes on credit, which schools are not allowed to do!). So, sadly, the three Schools are an example of the impact of the declining national education funding levels. My colleagues will work very hard to maintain the same standards, and as they are a resourceful bunch will find ingenious ways of working to be more efficient.

Catering

Exciting news! We have new caterers, a company called Caterlink. The catering contract we had with Taylor Shaw was up for renewal, so we brought in a consultant to run an independent tendering process, and to cut a long story short the contract has been awarded to Caterlink. Caterlink are a large, established education catering organisation, with extensive involvement in the FE sector, and schools in Cornwall and other south-west authorities. However, they do not have a foothold in Devon schools, so we will gain advantages as a result. The contract will bring some capital investment (always welcome), and students can expect to see changes starting in September and evolving thereafter. Clearly, a new caterer brings a great opportunity to review everything from the food offer to local sourcing to service points. Caterlink are also fully aware of the statutory nutritional guidelines for schools which will be reflected in the food on offer. Further, Caterlink are keen to be involved more than many companies in the life of the College, with extra-curricular activities and work-related opportunities. So, very exciting, although the punsters among you will be muttering that the proof of the pudding will be in the eating.....

Exam Season

After today, GCSEs are finished except for one Further Maths and one History exam. There are still plenty of A-levels up until 29th June, however. Things continue to go well; candidates have been superb in terms of punctuality, equipment and observing expectations so that there has been just one reportable breach of exam regulations, which barely distracted anyone else. The rest of the student body has also been excellent, especially in keeping quiet in the old playground area where most exams are based.

Other non-public exams are approaching. Year 12 will sit end of year exams from 21st - 23rd June, when the exam rooms are not being used for A-levels. Year 9 exams are being held from 26th - 28th June, but these will be for the Core subjects only and will be classroom based. With the changing of exams to a more linear model, tests and exams are becoming more important than before to encourage long-term memory and retention of information, and of course as a check on progress. The more people who drum this into our students the better, so your support is much appreciated. This is more difficult where an older sibling did modular exams and re-sits, as the approach was different then, and comparisons are not fair ones.

New Intake Non-Feeder Parents' Evening

There has got to be a better name for this event! On Wednesday, we held this extra transition meeting for students transferring from Primary to Clyst Vale on their own or in very small numbers. There was an excellent and heartening attendance. The evening was to introduce these students to each other; to give them an extra pre-visit to help with their confidence; and to reassure them and their parents that all will be well. Clyst Vale is noted for its humanity and compassion, and this is a good example. Our Year 7 helpers attended the same evening last year, and have thrived! Two of them met for the first time a year ago, and have become almost inseparable friends this year. Lots of preparatory work has been done behind the scenes, but this is the symbolic start of the transition process. New Intake Days are 5th - 7th July, and the Parents' Evening is on Wednesday 12th.

Year 7 Visit to Paris

Thank you very much indeed to parents who came to the pre-visit briefing on Tuesday. Having seen the itinerary, most wanted to go on the trip instead of their child! As I have said in Newsletters before, and to parents at this briefing, we will be following world events very closely and be in regular contact with tour companies and venues to ensure safety.

Manners

A key part of transition is imparting the College's values. One of our most important values is good manners. I can use other words such as respect, kindness, empathy towards others, politeness, tolerance of others, awareness of others' differences and difficulties, but "manners" sums it up. The vast majority of our students are well brought up (thank you!) and when their manners slip it's thoughtless rather than nastiness. Nonetheless, I have asked my colleagues to remind students about manners; most of our visitors comment on the good atmosphere and politeness of our students, and we wish to keep it that way.

Summer's Back!

We've entered another hot spell, so we're reminding all those forgetful teenagers about our expectations. Uniform does not fundamentally change; white tops, plain white undershirts, College jumpers. Skirts have to be of a decent length. Shorts are fine if of trouser material, although shorts aren't cool in the fashion sense in school from about Year 8 until Year 12. There's the annual issue of filling water bottles, as well. Many students do not really see the problem of having the maximum amount of break and lunchtime, and filling up in lesson time. Queues form, lessons start late, sometimes very late. Call me old-fashioned, but lessons are for learning, and water-bottle filling should be done in a student's own time and they need to take a few minutes off to do this. I have always been committed to providing water for students for the health benefits of being properly hydrated (it does not improve intelligence), but it is a privilege not a right.

As ever, thank you for your understanding, support and reinforcement of these messages. By being clear about all these peripheral things, it reduces the battles my colleagues sometimes face, means students spend more time in lessons, and improves learning.

Junior Maths Challenge Success 2017

Students at Clyst Vale achieved 3 golds, 9 silvers and 21 bronzes in this year's UKMT Junior Maths Challenge. Over 250,000 pupils from across the UK sat the challenge with roughly the top 6% receiving a gold certificate, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

Approximately 6,800 of the top students are invited to sit a follow-on competition, the Junior Mathematical Olympiad or Kangaroo. Congratulations to Jack Eynon who has qualified for this.

The Junior Maths Challenge is run by the UK Mathematics Trust and supported by the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries. It is aimed at those in Years 7 and 8 and is sat in schools.

School Transport

- Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver on every journey will be allowed to travel.
 Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at <u>www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk</u>.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal
 requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the
 responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
