#### Harry Patch Day

Next Thursday is Harry Patch Day. Clyst Vale had a connection to Harry Patch, who was the oldest surviving soldier from World War I when he died in 2009. Harry's wish was that young people should never forget about World War I, realise how fortunate they are, and make the most of themselves. So, at Clyst Vale we keep his memory alive with Harry Patch Day; 22<sup>nd</sup> September was Harry's personal remembrance day when his closest friends were killed but he survived, and we hold various fund-raising activities for Harry's preferred charity, the RNLI.

#### **Stagecoach and Bus Stops**

At 3.20 there are two dedicated Stagecoach buses running from Clyst Vale to the bus station. There is also a third public service bus; this is re-routed into the College by special arrangement so that students do not need to walk down Station Road to the Dog Village stop. This is clearly better for their safety, and enables us to supervise them on site. So, students heading into Exeter should not leave the site at the end of the day.

#### **Behaviour: The Annual Cycle**

In most years, the first two weeks of term go well, especially in lessons. However, there are sometimes squabbles on some of the buses, and sometimes rougher play at break and lunchtime. Fortunately, usually this only involves a minority of students, and we are vigilant in responding and heading it off. My principle is that Clyst Vale has a responsibility for students when they are on their way to and from College, and our expectations of courteous, considerate behaviour apply at all times. As for rough play, we will remind students about this regularly (as it can easily become bullying), and more practically have increased our levels of staff supervision this year. It's far better for students to engage with one of the many lunchtime activities on offer; a list will be issued with next week's Newsletter.

# **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

# **COLLEGE DRESS**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

# If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

#### Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

#### Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

#### PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
