Deep Learning Day

As ever, Tuesday's DLD went well. Inevitably, not every single activity will enthuse and inspire every single student, but those I spoke with were either positive or at the very least saw the point of what they were doing. Year 7 always have good fun with the Languages Day (partly because there is food involved), and the project-based Maths Day, although challenging, is similar in feel to project-based work common in Primaries. Another example is Year 9, where students were very positive about the development day, with the simulations of the paper factory and the realities of building a shelter particularly effective. You'll see below what Post-16 got up to! We use DLDs to supplement the Course 42 curriculum, so Year 10 had a Careers-focused day, and part of Year 11's was on safeguarding against on-line grooming. These days are highly valuable, but they do take a lot of organising, so a big thank you to the organisers: Mrs Coley, Miss Barratt, Mr Simpson, Mrs Klampfer-Hall, Mrs Bennett, Ms Chandler, Mrs Higginson and Miss Haynes.

Post-16 News

(Thank you to Miss Haynes for this report!)On Tuesday's Deep Learning Day, Year 12 and 13 took part in team building activities; Year 12 also attended Learn2Live (a presentation organised by Devon and Cornwall Emergency Services focusing on road safety) and Year 13 had support with their UCAS applications and plans for next year. The team building activities were created with inspiration from the TV programme 'Taskmaster'. Students had to complete a series of tasks as a team; the most significant being a task they had to complete before the day, which was to raise as much money as possible for a charity of their choice. We were particularly impressed with the way in which all of the students threw themselves into the charity task and as a whole the sixth form has raised over £1200 for the following charities: Macmillan Cancer Support, MIND, Save the Earth and Rethink Mental Health.

Special mention must go to Mia Hart in 12HP, who had her head shaved to raise money for Macmillan. With the support of her tutor group, she has currently pushed her total just over £1000, which is an incredible achievement and demonstrates real courage, particularly as she was in front of practically the whole school while it was being done! It's been a great start to the year and these efforts reveal what an outstanding group of young people we have in the Sixth Form.

Internet Safety

Two or three weeks ago, I warned parents about a free, downloadable app which pretends to be a safe dating app but during the game (as it is) one of the main characters takes their own life. Devon County Council have advised that in the future schools should not name these apps because if schools or parents ask children if they are playing a specific game, this may draw their attention to it. This advice is based on the UK Safer Internet Centre guidance that naming specific online content or games can increase the risk of creating media coverage and social media sharing, which can inadvertently promote the content to young audiences. The absolutely fundamental message is that parents should monitor carefully and encourage children to share what they are playing. On this theme, I am pleased to attach the NSPCC's "Share-Aware" parents' guide.

Y11 Boys v Blundell's





School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS FROM SEPTEMBER 2018

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. **If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.**

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- All trousers must have Clyst Vale logo rivet on waistband.
- Skirts Blue Tartan.
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
