Education Funding

At 10.00 this morning (Friday) you should have received a letter and a brief guide "Education on the Doorstep", providing questions you may wish to ask if a prospective political candidate turns up on *your* doorstep canvassing votes. This is part of the latest campaign by the Headteachers of fourteen counties to keep education funding in the spotlight as the build-up to the general election continues. Just a reminder that schools need an increase of £3bn *each year*. My colleagues and I will continue to make your children our first priority, but unless there is a major change nationally, our future students will receive a worse educational deal than even their older brothers or sisters a couple of years before them.

PTFA Meeting: Careers

It really is a shame that more people didn't attend this week's meeting. Nicola Bennett gave a really good presentation and engaged in discussion about Careers provision at Clyst Vale, how she intends to improve it, and some of the challenges as technology, firms and recruitment processes are changing so rapidly. We are already responding to this: for example, group assessment tasks are becoming more popular among recruiters. This was part of the focus of the recent BT "Bootcamp" attended by 35 Year 9 students. A key part of the Careers programme is Year 10 work experience, which will be four days from $17^{\text{th}} - 20^{\text{th}}$ July; thank you to parents who are also employers and offer placements – we are always looking for more business involvement!

Exam Season

My weekly update.....This week has gone extremely well. After a big (ie lots of students!) B&V exam on Monday there have been a handful of smaller GCSE exams. There are more big exams next week. Candidates' behaviour has been excellent, with literally only a couple of minor exceptions. County Show traffic did not cause any problems for students on certain buses being late. The rest of the College has adjusted quickly to the changed expectations and need for quiet. One or two students and parents have queried our approach to study leave for Year 11; we are in line with most schools in starting it from Monday 5th June. One or two nearby schools have allowed study leave from next Monday; equally, one or two are keeping students in for a week and in one case two weeks after half-term. I passed on my late mother's advice to one student: "If you look hard enough, you can always find someone better off and someone worse off than yourself'. We're happy with our compromise: for the majority of Clyst Vale students, they are better keeping to the routine.

Rites of Passage

Next Friday we will mark the departure of Years 11 and 13 with some small-scale celebrations for each year group. Symbolically, it's important – it's the last time the year groups will be together as a whole, even though many will meet up during exams and at the Proms at the end of June. The arrangements for Year 11 are similar to previous years: on Friday 26th May students will either be in an English Literature exam or in normal lessons 1 and 2. During lesson 3 the year group will congregate in Post-16 for some presentations and the customary hilarious PowerPoint presentation charting their five years with us; some haven't changed a bit..... There will also be a shirt-signing fest. During lesson 4, groups will be with their tutors for a fond farewell. Students will be free to go home at lunchtime with parents' permission (a formal letter has been sent by Schoolcomms). Year 13, as befits their senior status, will have a much more serene celebration in Post-16 at lunchtime, following a normal morning of lessons.

Social Media

Precisely a year ago, I warned parents about misuse of Instagram in which girls were being enticed into sending revealing photos of themselves. This followed on from a major fall-out among Year 9 girls. This year we have another fall-out, again among Year 9 girls (mostly). I suppose it's some comfort to students and parents involved that this seems to be a phase which passes, but it is yet another reminder about how unpleasant and distracting social media can be. If a student is worrying about social media, s/he is less likely to be learning effectively, is more likely to be constantly checking their phone, disturbing their sleep and setting up a vicious circle. The particular site at the moment is "sayat.me" which bills itself as an "anonymous feedback site"; parents with longer memories might recall "ask.fm" and the problems it caused, and "sayat.me" is of similar ilk: it allows the opportunity to post unpleasant, hurtful and offensive comments. We will do what we can in College to challenge and support, and if you have any concerns please report them.

If your child is interested in being part of the next Ski Trip in 2019 they need to collect a letter from Mrs Woolacott or from the folder outside of the PE office.

School Transport

- Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver on every journey will be allowed to travel.
 Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at <u>www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk</u>.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal
 requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the
 responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
