Dear Parents/Carers

Overall, the first major week of exams has gone very well indeed. It's an unbelievably complex organisational task, so there has been the occasional glitch, but overall candidates have been fantastic, and other students sensible and respectful near the exam rooms. It's important to remember that for Years 7-9, and Year 10 once Science exams are finished, it's business as usual. The normal timetable continues, lessons are taught, homework is set and we maintain our usual expectations. However, the additional focus on exams does have some impact on the whole College's routines: next week for example we have THREE early lunches on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday; lunch will start at 12.25, at the end of lesson three, with lesson four beginning at 1.20.

Year 11's last day will be Friday, 27th May. Each year, this is a bit like Frank Sinatra's farewell tours: we say goodbye, then they pop up again for exams, say goodbye, see them at the Prom, say goodbye and then have a reunion in November at the Certificate Evening. However, for students, the "last day" has become a rite of passage, so we will honour this with cake, a presentation showing how they have changed and grown over five years, and doubtless they will indulge in a spot of shirt-signing (I wonder what happened to these shirts? I can't imagine them being framed and handed on as a family heirloom, somehow). I have been asked by some people, nearly all of them students, why we didn't hold the "last day" earlier, before the exams started in earnest: there are several reasons, but the most powerful are educational. Although there are exceptions, most students work better in College, and have easy access to a range of subject experts and support networks. There is a small but growing trend of schools not allowing study leave until the very end of exams (so, Year 11, there is always someone worse off than you!).

There was a really good PTFA meeting this week, although once again thinly-attended by our dedicated group of stalwarts. The main thrust of the conversation was how to maintain and extend the "parent voice" aspect of the PTFA. One suggestion is that if people cannot attend meetings, then perhaps the PTFA could use e-mail to consult on what are the major issues and what activities may be successful. The PTFA has a list of e-mail contacts already, but if you would like to be added, please contact the PTFA Chair, Jenny Sanders, on ils.sanders@btinternet.com. Given the growing concerns around students' mental health and emotional wellbeing, the PTFA have asked that this is the topic to be covered as part of their AGM in October. Clyst Vale has a good reputation for this area of work, and we have been used as a case-study by Devon County Council for students with anxiety-based school absence and the challenges of reintegration. Later presentations requested by the group will include the internet and social media, and careers provision.

Safety and safeguarding (in the sense of child protection) are our first priority. Following Ofsted's visit last year, we have adjusted Library hours to ensure that the public are not using it at the same time as school hours, and the changed lay-out further reduces risk (and actually makes the Library look a whole lot better). In similar vein, we are now shutting all gates at 3.40 in the afternoon. Before, the College was wide open for anyone to wander in, whereas it is highly unlikely that during the mass exodus at 3.20 to 3.40 this would be possibly unnoticed, and there are staff on duty as well. Unfortunately, this means a change of habits for students involved in fixtures and after-school activities. They will have to exit through Reception. It also means a change of habits for parents wishing to watch fixtures, in that you will need to come in via Reception.

An early reminder about events which are of relevance to parents after half-term. In the first week back, there is a Year 8 Parents' Evening on Thursday 9th June. Sports Day and Festival on the Field is to be held on 29th June: can I underline that parents are welcome to attend – each year there is a myth that they are not, which I suspect comes from certain students who wish to keep home life and school life rigidly separated... The Year 11 Prom is on Friday 1st July at Reed Hall; clearly, this is another big rite of passage for students (and their parents) but always attracts a number of Year 10 students, presumably taking notes for next year. So, even though we are focused on them at the moment, there will be "life after exams".

Have a good weekend, especially if you follow Exeter Chiefs!


Year 11 Prom

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, around knee length and certainly no more than 10cm higher than the centre of the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
