Dear Parents/Carers,

Clyst Vale is a Top 100 School

I was thrilled and very proud to receive a letter from Nick Gibb, Minister of Education, informing me that Clyst Vale was "one of the top 100 non-selective state schools in England showing the greatest sustained improvement in GCSE and equivalent results between 2013 and 2015" and congratulating staff and pupils for this "excellent achievement". This is brilliant news. Parents will know that a colossal amount of time, effort and energy has gone into improving Clyst Vale over the past two or three years, and I am delighted that my colleagues and the College's students have earned this recognition which is thoroughly welldeserved. It is also very reassuring for parents of students coming up to GCSEs in the near future. What particularly pleases me is that to a very large extent we have avoided becoming an exam factory, know our students as individuals, retain our inclusive ethos, and recognise success in sport, drama, music, STEM and a range of other activities, too.

Year 9 Parents' Evening

Once again, a big "thank you" to parents for another excellent attendance at last night's parents' evening. Just under 80% of students were represented, demonstrating real strength in the home-school partnership. One aspect of the evening was confirming or finalising option decisions, and I hope that students and parents feel fully-informed! The deadline for option forms is next Friday, 4th March: there is no advantage to be gained in rushing it in early, but a minor disadvantage if late (because all the choices are entered into the computerised timetable package in one go).

Year 11 Parents Pre-Exam Information Evening

This important evening is next Tuesday, 1st March, at 6.00 pm in Post-16. It takes the form of a briefing about exam preparation, exam regulations, and what to do if various health or other problems occur during the exam period. We are always delighted to see our students, but this presentation will be repeated for Year 11 in an assembly so it is not essential that they attend the evening. Mrs Power, Exams Officer, Mr Green, Vice-Principal, and I will be there as this is clearly also an opportunity to raise individual questions or issues.

Kirkland Rowell Survey

Thank you again to the 163 parents who completed the Kirkland Rowell questionnaire. We have now had the results, which are published in full on the new website http://www.clystvale.org/cvcc/college-information/how-are-we-doing/

There is a vast number of tables and graphs, but the main headlines are a very good overall performance score, and almost every aspect good or better (these are not Ofsted judgements, but loosely reflect them). The executive summary can be found on page 3 of the report. Like most organisations, we have an improvement plan, and this survey is used as part of an interim review of that plan, as well as contributing towards next year's.

Sports Report

Further to the Newsletter prior to half-term, we were thrilled that Rachel Champion (Y8) was recognised for her incredible season in athletics by being awarded runner-up in the Express & Echo Sports Awards Category for Junior Sportsperson of the Year. Meanwhile, ex-student Kelsea Purchall did fantastically well to win a Bronze medal at the Youth Olympics, and was given the great honour of carrying the British flag at the closing ceremony.

Litter

Over half-term, premises and grounds staff made a huge effort to clean up the site, and it was litter-free on Monday morning. Therefore, it is very disappointing that litter is already becoming visible again. 



COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no "skinnies", jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, around knee length and certainly no more than 10cm higher than the centre of the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

You need to let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If you do not notify the College, then your Assistant to Head of School (AtHoS) will contact you to identify the reason for absence.

This will help to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

School Transport

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.
