Remembering the Holocaust

Today we were enormously privileged to welcome Lady Milena Grenfell-Baines, who escaped Czechoslovakia on literally the day before World War II started. She was rescued as one of almost 700 Czech children on the trains organised by English stockbroker Nicholas (later Sir Nicholas) Winton. Lady Milena told her remarkable story, placed firmly in the lead up to the Holocaust, and our students were so respectful and spellbound that you could have heard a pin drop. The story of the Winton trains is truly inspirational, and there will be much more about this very special event in next week's Newsletter. Holocaust Memorial Day was on Wednesday, and in assemblies this week there have been presentations by Sixth Formers Lucy and Cam, two students who visited Auschwitz concentration camp as part of the Holocaust Educational Trust's ambassador's programme. Also, despite media reports of teachers unable to teach about this period of history properly, I can reassure parents that at Clyst Vale it is covered by trained, experienced history teachers.

500 Up!

Year 11 Parents' Evening

The Year 11 Parents' Evening is always well attended, and Tuesday's was no exception. 74% of students were represented, and although the evening was generally very positive, there are always a few students who have to face up to some realities. Despite all the changes in education policies and assessment regimes, it is still fundamentally true that the harder you work, the better you will do. The next formal

point of contact for parents is the Exams & Revision Information Evening on Tuesday 1st March. This will be a briefing about exam regulations and procedures, with some advice on revision planning and techniques in the run up to GCSEs.

Year 9 Options

Students in Year 9 received their Options Booklet in assembly this morning. It was made clear that this is a really important document, and in the unlikely event that it does not make it home tonight, will be available on the website next week. The booklet outlines the key dates and details of the process, and a brief summary of all the subjects available. The first key date for parents is the Options Evening on Tuesday, 9th February. Making option choices can be a very big and sometimes emotional issue for some students, so it is essential that they, and parents, have all the information possible. This is doubly so as national reforms to GCSEs mean that we are in the second year of significant changes.

Today we offer our best wishes to two support staff colleagues who are leaving Clyst Vale. Mrs Cathy Sharkey has worked in our Exams Office, and latterly as Data Manager, for a total of nine years; both of her children have been educated at Clyst Vale, and she has been an active and loyal member of the PTFA. For all of these reasons, she will be missed and we wish her well in her new post at ATASS on the Science Park. Luke Haydon, Assistant Caretaker, takes up a new position at Exeter University; Luke is a former Clyst Vale student, and it is very encouraging to see how his two stints at the College have allowed him to progress in his career.

I must admit that the bottles look exactly like sugary drinks available in many supermarkets, which I suppose is part of a deliberate marketing ploy. Quite right to enquire, too, as there is a national focus on the amount of sugar in food products. I can reassure parents that the sugar content in Radnor Fizz is typically 5g/100 ml, below half of any common brand name equivalent, and is entirely natural sugar from the concentrated fruit base. There is no added refined sugar. The company, and our caterers, ensure that all foods and drinks on offer are "school compliant", and keep this constantly under review.

School Admission Arrangements

for state-funded schools 2017-18 and Education Travel Arrangements 2016-17

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no "skinnies", jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, around knee length and certainly no more than 10cm higher than the centre of the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or <u>all black</u> trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

Main uniform can be purchased from SWI online shop or Thomas Moore.

PE kit is only available from SWI online shop.

The reversible jacket is only available from Thomas Moore.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

You need to let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If you do not notify the College, then your Assistant to Head of School (AtHoS) will contact you to identify the reason for absence.

This will help to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

School Transport


- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.
