# Year 11 Parents' Evening

Thank you to parents of Year 11 students who came to the parents' evening on Tuesday, some of you for the last time. As ever, this was a well-attended evening, with 75% of students represented. This particular parents' evening is timed after the mock exams, just before exam entries are finalised, and with over three months before GCSEs start in earnest. Every Year 11 student is an individual, and each one has their own recent history of the last year or two; therefore, for some students three months is enough time to turn around a poor recent history, fill gaps, work really hard and achieve well. For others, who have worked hard throughout their time here, it is comforting to know that the end is coming into sight. The reduction in coursework in some subjects means that there is a little less pressure overall than in previous years, which is clearly a help. Yet again, I find myself repeating time-honoured educational advice: know your strengths and weaknesses, get organised, make some sacrifices, put the effort in, listen and act on teachers' advice, and you will be successful.

# "Stranger Danger"

There was an incident on Tuesday in Stoke Canon in which a car driver stopped and asked a Clyst Vale student to get in his car. Sensibly, she refused, moved quickly to an area of safety, and the car eventually drove away; it was a blue Volkswagen. We informed the police and have followed their advice closely. While this is most likely to have been a one-off incident, it is a reminder to us all to ensure that students know the dangers of talking to strangers, and have rehearsed a safe route home from College or the bus stop. With several hundred students travelling to and from Clyst Vale by bus each day, it is also why we have never had a blanket ban on mobile - now smart phones.

# **Year 9 Options**

Year 9 parents will receive a paper copy of the Options Booklet next Tuesday; if not, blame the pupil post, and have a rummage in his or her bag. Like most things in life, the Year 9 Options process is straightforward for most, tricky for some, and a source of great stress for a few. The fundamental premise is to gather all the information, do not rush to judgement, contemplate the options, then make decisions. There has always been evolution and change in options, caused by national or local requirements and influences; when I started at Clyst Vale, there was only one free option column because the National Curriculum was so prescriptive. This year's big change is an expectation that our top 50% of linguists will follow a GCSE language (in French or Spanish), as detailed in a letter from Mr Green two or three weeks ago. There are all sorts of reasons for this, detailed in the letter and the Options Booklet: studying a language broadens horizons, supports cognitive development and literacy, shows breadth, is attractive to employers and higher education, and for a College with an above-average profile our take-up of languages at GCSE has been surprisingly low.

# Apprenticeship Day 1st February

A new addition to our Careers programme is an Apprenticeship Day organised by Mrs Bennett, to be held next Wednesday for targeted Years 10 & 11 students, with some Sixth Formers. Students will be looking at applying for apprenticeships and will be given guidance so that they have the knowledge and skills to be able to secure a placement next year. The day includes a Year 10 assembly, workshops for Year 11 and Sixth Form, and a follow-up session with the Careers Adviser.

#### PTFA: Internet Use and Safety

The PTFA hosted a brilliant, informative and at times shocking evening on internet safety, especially the risks of social media. Parents attending represented a cross-section, including some very savvy digital users, but everyone learned something new. Guest speaker Gary Gates recently retired from the police, but has maintained contacts and training, so is fully up to date. The evening was targeted at parents, of course, and included a few do's and don'ts about their own use of social media, and how to keep an eye on teenagers' use. It also covered issues like the way algorithms and settings are a threat to critical thinking and making judgements, especially in the not fully-formed teenage brain. The presentation will be put on our website: you will hopefully be aware that there is an "online safety" page on both the parent and student tab; this includes links to national organisations' website information and to helplines. We have invited Gary back to talk to students after half-term. There was also a short presentation by Mr Colin about how we educate students about being safe on-line through ICT lessons, Course 42, Deep Learning Days, and how our pastoral teams tackle issues when they arise, most commonly cyber-insults.

# **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

# **COLLEGE DRESS**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal.

If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

# Uniform for all Students in Years 7 to 11

- · White collared shirt.
- School colour tie.
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with School colour logo.
- Trousers should be plain, black, formal and full length. This means no jeans, leggings, chinos or any trousers with rivets or studs. Trousers must be worn on the waist.
- Skirts should be plain black, and may be worn just above the knee. Skirts must be A-line or straight, but not stretchy or "skater" style.
- Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

**All uniform can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter.** Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at <a href="https://www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk">www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk</a>.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- · Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College – extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
