As ever, we had a full church; excellent mince pies (thank you Mrs Crook and Year 10); mulled wine (thank you, Parents Group); and a wide variety of readings and music to suit every taste, including one or two stand out performances, and one or two obvious new talents in younger years stepping forward. Unfortunately, I was unwell and couldn't go; I really missed it!



#### **Amnesty & Human Rights Day**

I am grateful to Miss Watt for the following account of last Friday's event, but even more so for her championing work supporting both the College's Rights Respecting School initiative and our student Amnesty Group.

"On Friday 14th 2018 to coincide with the 70th Anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and our work as a Rights Respecting School, all students took part in some Human Rights learning. There were special assemblies for Years 7-9 on Thursday, and Years 10-11 on Friday.

All students in Years 7 and 8 took part in an hour long workshop to stand up for two cases that are part of Amnesty International's annual Write for Rights project. We learnt about Atena Daemi, an Iranian woman held in horrendous conditions in an Iranian jail for simply posting on Instagram about abolishing the death penalty. She is being held for 7 years after a 15 minute trial for crimes against the state. Students who wished to, wrote a letter to the Iranian embassy calling for her immediate release. Students also learnt about Marielle Franco who was assassinated in Brazil in March this year. There has been no investigation into her death but she was a human rights defender in a country where 70 people who have stood up for human rights have been murdered in the last year. Some students wrote beautiful and heartfelt cards to the family.

In addition, there was a cake and sweet sale and a fabulous talent show that showcased talent from throughout the year groups at lunchtime. There were around 500 students in the hall watching and we managed to raise around £300 for Amnesty International. Many thanks to all the students who donated cakes and more importantly time. Also a big thanks to Mrs Battishill, Mr Pearce and Miss Williams for their help and support with the day. Clyst Vale has a proud record for standing up against human rights violations. As a Rights Respecting School, long may this tradition continue."

#### **Staff Changes**

Leaving at the end of this term is Dr Walters, after many years of great service to the College. Dr Walters joined in 2000 as Head of the-then PE and Performing Arts Faculty, before internal promotion to Deputy Principal. Many students and colleagues have cause to be very grateful to Dave for his encouragement and support over the years, particularly with regard to teaching & learning approaches and teacher training. From the student perspective, perhaps Dave's most obvious legacy is Clyst Vale's glorious Sports Day, which he created and introduced. Sadly, Dave has been unwell for several months, and we wish him well for a full recovery.

Miss Hayley Johns is also leaving our Languages team, to a permanent post at Isca College. Hayley had made a very bright start at Clyst Vale, and we wish her well for her future career in teaching. Mrs Katie List is a third leaver, to take up a position at Exeter School; it's no secret that we had some staffing challenges with a spate of maternities last year, and we were very lucky that Katie was available as a teacher of Physics and Maths. Similarly, Mrs Tania Gale returned to us for a term on a part-time basis to teach some Maths, and has eased us through the term. Clearly, we would all like continuity of staffing; however, sometimes this just is not possible, and we have done well to recruit specialist teachers in shortage subjects.

#### Uniform

It has been really, really good this term, and thank you so much to parents and carers for your support. We are well aware that teenagers have sudden growth spurts, and that eventually shoes wear out. So, if you are buying uniform over the Christmas break, please make sure it conforms to the dress code on our website! And, for the umpteenth time, please try to help us explain that hoodies are not coats.......

#### Finally...

On behalf of all my colleagues, a huge "thank you" to all parents and carers for all of your support through 2018. It's been a while since my three were teenagers, but I still vividly recall sitting in school car parks after dark to do the pick-up, disentangling huge crises which were nothing of the sort, trying to explain that school rules are fundamentally reasonable, and doing extra food shopping at exam times (for example). 

#### **School Transport**

- 1. Clyst Vale supports the (DCC) Devon County Council's "No Pass No Travel Scheme" that operates on transport to and from this College.
- 2. Only students who show a valid travel pass to the driver **on every journey** will be allowed to travel. Students must travel on the vehicle indicated on their pass.
- 3. Please ensure that your child has their travel pass before they leave home every day.
- 4. Please ensure that your child knows what to do in the event they are not allowed to travel or the bus does not arrive (e.g. because of breakdown or traffic conditions or severe weather). College attendance is very important and it is best to be prepared for any of these eventualities.
- 5. DCC will carry out regular pass checks throughout the year.
- 6. Drivers are not allowed to carry passengers who cannot show a valid pass.
- 7. If your child loses their pass during the day they should go to the AtHoS offices to ask for a 10 day temporary pass. Replacement passes cost £5 each and can be ordered online, or by sending a cheque with a replacement form.

#### **COLLEGE DRESS**

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

#### Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- All trousers must have Clyst Vale logo rivet on waistband.
- Skirts Blue Tartan.
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn in the summer.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
