Dear Parents and Carers,

Exam Season Concludes

After today, there is just one exam remaining on Monday with just one student (good luck, Natalie!). Once again, I must pay tribute to our Year 11, 12 and 13 students who have been magnificent in facing the first exams for three years, and I am so proud of all of them. The rest of the student body has been excellent throughout the exam season, as well. Special tribute goes to our Exams Team, none of whom were here in 2019 for the last set of exams, and who have been as amazing (in different ways) as the students. We avoided an invigilator crisis, and if anything built a bigger, better team. There were challenges with students requiring invigilation at home, and several with medical conditions requiring individual rooms, but all of that went well. Of course there were occasional mix-ups and issues, but not many and none very serious. The acid test will be Results Days, but I am delighted that the actual process of sitting exams has gone so well. And a final but very important "thank you" to parents and carers for all your support of your child. I sometimes make light of this with reference to keeping the fridge stocked with snacks, but your contribution cannot be overestimated.

When I say "concludes", that's not quite right – Year 12 have end-of-term exams next week, although these are not public AS or A-Levels.......

Year 6 to Year 7 Transition

It was fantastic to welcome Year 6 pupils and their parents to last night's special evening for pupils not in our catchment area. Many of these pupils transfer in ones or twos from their school, so the evening gives them a chance to meet others in the same situation so Induction Days are a little bit easier. Our Year 7 student ambassadors did a great job, and it's always a delight to see how far they have progressed in a year, which in itself is reassuring for the Year 6s. A big thank you to Miss Matthews for organising the evening, and to any readers who were there last night accompanying a younger child. It was really good to have informal conversations with parents, too.

Smartphone Policy

One good thing about transition is that it's a useful reminder of our policies and approaches. A good example is our smartphone policy. Students must keep their phones off and in their bags from when they walk in through the College gates to when they walk out again. This is for everyone's safety, to prevent cyber-bullying or inappropriate use (taking photos or filming without permission). Phones are a massive distraction, and we want students to talk to each other or take part in activities, not sit glued to a screen. If a phone is seen during the day, it will be confiscated until 3.20 that day. A second offence will require

parents to pick it up. A third time will mean a meeting with parents. If a student refuses to cooperate, this is defiance and will be treated more seriously. This doesn't sound like cuddly Clyst Vale, but it is very important for students' safety, to encourage them to participate, and ultimately learn more effectively.

Uniform

We also talked about uniform. Although the majority of our students are in good uniform (thank you), the percentage who aren't increases a bit at this time of year. We would like a perfect start in September, so please pay close attention to the dress code which is in every Newsletter. The big issue at present is plain black footwear; these can be plain black trainers. We do understand that there is a cost of living crisis, and that some students will outgrow their school shoes, and that it makes more sense to get new ones in August rather than now; however, in August please buy plain black ones!

Year 12 Visit to Plymouth University

It was blue skies and bright sunshine for the Year 12 visit to Plymouth University on Wednesday. Although the visit took place on the date of the University's general Open Day, the Outreach Team had very kindly designed a bespoke programme for CVCC students, who were ushered away separately and given VIP treatment! The Agenda for the day covered student finance, UCAS and Personal Statements and a campus tour - with the opportunity over lunch for both Q&A with student ambassadors and to engage with various support stands. There was then just enough time for a session in one of the University's computer suites, where students familiarised themselves with the online UCAS application process. All in all a very successful day, with thanks to Miss Haynes, Mr Hill, Mrs Klampfer-Hall and Mr Powell for leading the visit.

Year 10 Sex and Health Education Day

The sunshine which bathed Plymouth also made classrooms quite hot here in Broadclyst. Nonetheless, Year 10 students responded really well to their day on sex and health education, engaged positively and stayed on task despite the heat. The topics covered are really relevant for young people: contraception, STIs, pornography, and self-examination for cancer. Clearly, these titles are quite stark, but the sessions were delivered carefully and responsibly by my colleagues who are experienced in teaching sensitive issues. Thanks go to the team, and to Mrs Bennett for organising the day as well as teaching. Days such as this make an important contribution to student welfare.

T-levels are becoming established as another option for students post-16. Broadly, T-levels are the size and value of three A-levels, are in vocational subjects, and include 45 days of work experience. Rough Play

We have had a couple of worse than usual injuries, both caused by friendship groups or associates messing around and it going wrong in some way. It's not usually bullying, and it certainly isn't random; this means that the majority of students are never involved and are quite safe. It's mostly boys, mostly Years 7 and 8. We remind students frequently in notices, assemblies and tutorials; students know that rough play is wrong, and is not respectful; there are duty staff at breaks and lunchtimes; where appropriate, rough play will be punished quite severely, including fixed-term suspension. However, at the same time we are trying to encourage and develop students to take some responsibility for themselves.

Summer Holiday Support for Families

The cost of living crisis is hitting some families really hard, and I have been asked to publicise the foodbanks in East Devon which will be operating throughout the school summer holiday period: Broadclyst Foodbank, EDDC support for Axminster tenants, Honiton Foodsave, Littleham Community Fridge, Nourish Axminster, Ottery Larder, Pippins Community Centre (Axminster), Seaton Foodsave and Sid Valley Foodbank. 

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs.

If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can.

Thank you for your support in helping your child maximise their attendance and learning.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- Skirts Blue Tartan and knee length
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn.
- Black sturdy shoes or all black trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
