

Why study a Language?

Reason 1: The global tech industry is booming

'I want a job in tech but employers want me to speak a second language.' In this increasingly globalised world, languages have become like currency or stock - the more you speak, the higher your value rises.

Reason 2: Languages give students the edge

"Language skills are very sought after by employers," says economist Pawel Adrjan. GCSE or A Level qualifications in languages open doors for traditional careers but also in digital marketing, social media and sales.

Reason 3: Languages open up the world

Learning any language can make us more successful working abroad and builds resilience and agility. It provides 'cultural capital'. We're living in the age of the soft skills, so being good listeners and communicators will give you the edge in networking and keep future options open.



Reason 4: Employers know language students are quick learners

Languages give you the edge because they're academically rigorous and challenging to learn and therefore not mastered by many. In applying ourselves to a second language, we improve our aptitude for study itself, especially our listening and communication abilities.

Reason 5: Languages boost confidence

Speaking a second language teaches you communication, presentation and soft skills that help you to connect to your audience more. All these transferable skills will give your overall confidence levels a boost, regardless of the scenario.



The English Baccalaureate (Ebacc)

The EBacc is a set of subjects at GCSE. To achieve the EBacc students need to achieve a Grade 5 or above in English, Maths, History or Geography, 2 Sciences and a Modern Foreign Language.



The EBacc What are the advantages?

The EBacc offers a broad and balanced curriculum in a range of traditional "academic" subjects. Achieving a good grade in a Humanity and a Language on top of the core subjects demonstrates a wide range of skills and qualities, which are becoming increasingly important in the current global economic climate.
