Han understands work well during class. He needs to try and consolidate his understanding by using revision tools outside of the classroom. In preparation for mocks and final exams, they need to engage fully with the homework revision programme we started last month: revision for a topic is set every week according to a schedule that has been shared with students. They need to use the mark schemes provided, paying attention to detail and the use of language in accepted answers. If they stick to the schedule, they will have revised most of the content by Easter and had regular practice of exam style questions.
