Dear Parents and Carers,

Apologies for the brevity of this week's offering. I've been laid low by one of the many bugs doing the rounds.

Strike Days Next Week

I have written separately about this. I suppose the surprise might be that we are bringing in Year 10 on Wednesday and Year 8 on Thursday when the "obvious" thing might have been to bring in Year 11 as on the two previous strike days. The thinking behind this was that Year 11 have just finished exams and have plenty of independent work to do, so it is perhaps less critical that they attend; on the timetable for the two days it will be more straightforward to supervise the other years; Year 10 are also an exam year; and it may help some families if the year groups affected were "shared around" a little.



Badminton Fixture Report

A very well done to the badminton squads from Key Stage 3 and 4 who played in a great fixture against St Peters on Thursday. With few teams willing to play the strong Clyst Vale squad we were very grateful for this match and the repeat fixture in two weeks time. Sophia Blum captained the younger girls to a good win 6 rubbers to 4. Supported by the power of Kate, Vanessa and Dulcie and the subtlety of Daisy they took the first 4 rubbers unchallenged. Sophia ended the evening unbeaton in under the gallery of supporting parents. They Key Stage 3 boys were led by Jacob and Aiden ranked 1 and 2. The team won 8 out of 9 rubbers but this did not reflect how close some of the games were. Marlon worked well with Aiden and Owen stepped in with his clever drop shots along side Jake who had adapted his game well from tennis. Two great sets of students coached by Post 16 student Harry Thompson who was both supportive, demanding and helpful with some of the more complex rules.

Key stage 4 had two teams of boys this time around and the boys who have been starved of matches were up for the fixture. Year 11 boys James and Steven where supported by the Year 10 players Archie, Alex and Will. The level of play here was great to watch and with the added power and a few more years of practice it was clear what the younger students should aspire to. The power of Archie, Alex and Steven pushed the opposition players around and opened up opportunities to finish the rallies. Alex and Will showed deft touch around the net and hit some superb angles tight to the front court to complete an 8-2 win for Clyst Vale. The return match is in two weeks when there will be some personal change in the Clyst Vale ranks, but those that represented tonight did so with sportsmanship and respect and a good deal of energy and enthusiasm. Noah Powell again contributed two goals before a cheek overhead kick that stuck the bar from Henry who calmly slotted the ball home for 3-0. Freddie was finally beaten by a great finish from St Peters to make the final score 3-1.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can.

COLLEGE DRESS

Clyst Vale aims to maintain a simple pattern of College dress to promote a clear sense of identity and enable students to come sensibly dressed, at reasonable cost, for a range of learning activities. If a student is improperly dressed, correct uniform will be provided for that day or the student may be sent home to change his/her clothing, at the discretion of the Principal. If parents are in any doubt about the suitability of an item of uniform they should check with the College before buying it.

Uniform for all students in Years 7 to 11

- White collared shirt
- School colour tie
- Clyst Vale V-neck jumper with College logo.
- Boys trousers Banner Slimbridge (Black)/Banner Falmouth (Black).
- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- Skirts Blue Tartan and knee length
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

All uniform and PE Kit can be purchased from Thomas Moore, Exeter. Thomas Moore offers both a personal service in their shop and also the opportunity to order on line at www.thomasmooretoymaster.co.uk

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.

The Principal, in consultation with the Governors of the College, will decide on the suitability of the appearance of a student attending the College - extreme hair styles, of either cut or colour, are not permitted.
