School Transport News



We keep close track of Clyst Vale buses which arrive late at either end of the day, and report persistent problems to Devon School Transport. However, parent power is highly effective, too. If your child takes school transport, and you're not happy with the service provided, please contact them yourself in addition to us using email studentservices@clystvale.org. No Pass No Travel scheme, and spot inspections this term. We were expecting a check from Devon Council Transport Team last term, this did not happen so it is likely they will be checking the passes soon. Added to this, there has been a noticeable increase in students wanting temporary bus passes because they've left the proper one at home. For both of these reasons, if your child gets on Clyst Vale transport, please make sure they have their pass with them. If your child has lost their pass they will need to get a temporary bus pass from Student Services by lunch time. You will also need to apply for a replacement via this [link https://services.devon.gov.uk/web/replacement-travel-passes/application](https://services.devon.gov.uk/web/replacement-travel-passes/application) . The cost of a replacement bus pass is £5.00.

Please be aware that unless your child is registered to be on a certain Clyst Vale bus, we cannot issue a temporary bus pass for them to travel, for instance to go to a friend's house.



Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can. Thank you for your support in helping your child maximise their attendance and learning.
