Dear Parents and Carers

Half-Term !

Well, that was an action-packed few weeks, what with bank holidays, strike days, a coronation, and earlier this week an abdication. Ten Tors was just a month ago. Almost before we knew it, exam season was upon us, and now it looks like summer is here. Thank you as ever for all your support over the past fragmented weeks, and for ensuring that the stop-start breaks in routine were navigated as smoothly as they were. Year 11 and Study Leave

Year 11 were really great on Wednesday, when we observed the usual rites of passage (shirt signing, speeches, cake, and a presentation of mostly embarrassing school photos). They are a lovely year group, and we'll miss them. However, it wasn't too emotional: all of them came back less than 24 hours later for science exams.

A reminder about study leave for Year 11 and Year 11s of the future. The College grants study leave: it isn't an entitlement. It is also with the consent of parents. This means we could in theory withdraw it for an individual, and parents could and sometimes do express a wish for their child to remain on site. Students are only required in College for their exams (or if invited for other reasons); afterwards, students are free to go home. Home means home: students are not allowed to hang around in Broadclyst or in town. If they have a morning and an afternoon exam, students are expected to remain on site (unless home is in walking distance). On site, Year 11 have a supervised study room in P7 (Sixth Form) during lesson time. So, in a nutshell, students are either in an exam, in P7 unless it's break or lunchtime or an organised revision class, or at home or on their way.



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Student Board

A quick update. We had nearly 50 students expressing an interest in joining the Student Board. They are now writing their election manifesto/ statement for Teams; these are due in by the end of Monday, 5th June, but can be submitted beforehand. These will be on Year Group Teams for a few days before elections in w/b 12th June.

Hot weather and uniform

We don't have a summer uniform because it's perfectly ok to wear a short-sleeve white shirt and tailored shorts all year round. *IF* it gets hotter in a few weeks' time we may allow students to not wear ties. PE shorts, and in fact any PE kit, is NOT school uniform. At the request of the former student council, the PE department kindly allow students who have PE lesson 5 to wear PE kit home, and on a Friday students taking part in inter-tutor competitions do not have to change. I have to be honest, this can be a bit confusing and it's easy for students to take advantage. Also, some parents may not be happy about their children going home on a public bus in PE kit, so please make your wishes clear.

So, in short (sorry...) PE kit is not acceptable uniform for most of the time, and shorts are absolutely fine provided they are tailored ones.

Country Life

One of the delights of our rural position is that over the years we have experienced various invasions by sheep, cows, flying ants and a fox, with dwellings built by wasps and swifts among others. Various birds have popped in to see us indoors, most famously a rook and a seagull, and I haven't mentioned the mice and several thousand rabbits. Anyway, a new one on us was the arrival of a swarm of bees yesterday, which took up temporary residence in a hedge outside the Humanities block. I am reliably informed that it was a decent-sized swarm of perhaps 15,000 bees; but it's amazing how small a ball they cram themselves into. The area was cordoned off, we set up a one-way diversion, and were able to secure the services of two local beekeeping parents to render the situation safe. You just don't get this excitement in a city school.



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Clyst Vale Dual Use Library

One of the unique features of Clyst Vale is that we have a dual use library located within the College, which we have fought to keep for many years and of which we are massively proud. The library is open to the public on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at the end of the school day, and is open to the students at Clyst Vale Community College throughout the week. The entrance to access the library is through Clyst Vale's main entrance (Reception,) then turning right, from there you will see the Library entrance. The stock for the public library is clearly a little on the small side, but the public library has full access to all the services provided by Libraries Unlimited (formerly known as Devon Libraries).

IT and Network Disruption during half term

Network Manager Graeme Lee writes..."In order to upgrade and improve parts of our IT services, there will be large interruptions to IT services throughout the half-term week (obviously this can't be done during the term!). Telephones will be affected. OneDrive, Teams and email will not be affected outside of the College. Hopefully being in the holiday will reduce any inconvenience, but please accept our apologies just in case; the work is very necessary for our IT provision in the College for all users."

Usually, the older students aren't doing anything particularly mean, they are just bigger in a confined space. To address this matter, after half-term we will "zone" the main block toilets. This is a grandiose way of saying that the toilets on the Reception side will be for Years 9, 10 (and 11, when they are in); those on the other side by AR1 and VO1 will be for Years 7 and 8 only.

CIF Bid Success

I am delighted to say that thanks to the bid put together by College Manager Ann Hopkins, we have been awarded just over $\pounds 600,000$ to do the rest of the roofs (rooves?) not covered in our last successful bid. Not especially glamorous or even visible, but important nonetheless. Let's hope there is less scaffolding for a much shorter time than previously....

School Nurse and First Aid Provision


Like pretty much all secondary schools in Devon, we don't have a School Nurse. The School Nursing Service provides a referral service to external agencies for a small number of individual students. Similarly we don't have a first aid room with a bed, and although our First Aiders are trained, it is not to the higher levels. This is why we ask parents not to send in your children if they are ill, because we can't diagnose anything and will ask you to come and get them. If a child has an accident requiring medical attention, we will contact you and, if serious, an ambulance. We have no facility to keep a sick or injured child on site for an extended period. So, if we do give you a call, we're really not trying to be difficult or pass the buck!

Key Reminders for Students Taking Exams

- If you have an exam, you wait in the playground/outside the exam room 10-15 minutes before the start time.
- · You only go to registration if you do not have an exam at that time.
- Remember that exam room rules are much stricter than school rules, and usually there are no excuses.
- Equipment: black pens and spares, pencils, ruler, eraser, full maths/science equipment (calculator when allowed, protractor, compass). Clear pencil case.
- No labels on water bottles which must be see-through.
- No watches, no internet-enabled devices, no smartphones.
- Coats and hoodies even leavers' hoodies are not permitted in the exam rooms.
- · No sweets or gum (exception for health reasons).
- Students in the Hall will leave coats and bags in the changing rooms which will be locked.
- · Full, proper College uniform expected
- When leaving your exam, remember others may not have finished (so don't gather in the playground !)





Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Please let the College know of any absence on the first day it occurs. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness.

If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy.

Please note, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if a student is absent from College due to illness.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first, and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. Therefore, we ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment, if they can.

COLLEGE DRESS

- Girls trousers Trutex GTN (2 pocket black)/David Luke DL965 black).
- Skirts Blue Tartan and knee length
- Trutex Senior stitched down/Taylor Tartan (blue) skirt and may be worn no more than 2" above the knee. Knee length black tailored shorts may be worn.
- Black sturdy shoes or **all black** trainers.
- White socks or black tights with skirts.
- Clyst Vale reversible jacket or other outdoor coat.

- Eyebrow jewellery, facial, tongue, nose and lip studs are not permitted.
- Leather jackets, all denim garments and all hoodies are not permitted.
- Hats should not be worn indoors.
- Outer coats should be predominantly plain in colour and without large logos.
- A plain white t-shirt or vest may be worn under the shirt.
- On health and safety grounds, shoes should be appropriate for a work place. Flipflops, open toes, Uggs, Dr Martens (or equivalent) are not permitted.
- Jewellery may be worn, providing it is not excessive or potentially hazardous. However, it is a legal requirement that all jewellery must be removed before undertaking sporting activities. It is the responsibility of the wearer to do this.
